Arquivos do Centro cultural Calouste Gulbenkian, 1998 *Being Portuguese in Spanish* Jonathan William Wade, 2020-04-15 Among the many consequences of Spain's annexation of Portugal from 1580 to 1640 was an increase in the number of Portuguese authors writing in Spanish. One can trace this practice as far back as the medieval period although it was through Gil Vicente, Jorge de Montemayor and others that Spanish language texts entered the mainstream of literary expression in Portugal. Proficiency in both languages gave Portuguese authors increased mobility throughout the empire. For those with literary aspirations, Spanish offered more opportunities to publish and greater readership, which may be why it is nearly impossible to find a Portuguese author who did not participate in this trend during the dual monarchy. Over the centuries, these authors and their works have been erroneously defined in terms of economic opportunism, questions of language loyalty and other reductive categories. Within this large group, however, is a subcategory of authors who used their writings in Spanish to imagine, explore and celebrate their Portuguese heritage. Manuel de Faria e Sousa, ngela de Azevedo Jacinto, Cordeiro Antnio de Sousa de Macedo and Violante do C u among many others offer a uniform yet complex answer to what it means to be from Portugal, constructing and claiming their Portuguese identity from within a Castilianized existence. Whereas all texts produced in Iberia during the early modern period reflect the distinct social, political and cultural realities sweeping across the peninsula, to some degree, Portuguese literature written in Spanish offers a unique vantage point from which to see these converging landscapes. *Being Portuguese in Spanish* explores the cultural cross-pollination that defined the era and reappraises a body of works that uniquely addresses the intersection of language, literature, politics and identity.

French Primitivism and the Ends of Empire, 1945-1975 Daniel J. Sherman, 2011-11-15 For over a century, the idea of primitivism has motivated artistic modernism. Focusing on the three decades after World War II known in France as *les trentes glorieuses*, despite the loss of most of the country's colonial empire, this probing and expansive book argues that primitivism played a key role in a French society marked by both economic growth and political turmoil. In a series of chapters that consider significant aspects of French culture, including the creation of new museums of French folklore and of African and Oceanic arts and the development of tourism against the backdrop of nuclear testing in French Polynesia, Daniel J. Sherman shows how primitivism, a collective fantasy born of the colonial encounter, proved adaptable to a postcolonial, inward-looking age of mass consumption. Following the likes of Claude Lvi-Strauss, Andr e Putman and Jean Dubuffet through decorating magazines, museum galleries and Tahiti's pristine lagoons, this interdisciplinary study provides a new perspective on primitivism as a cultural phenomenon and offers fresh insights into the eccentric edges of contemporary French history.

Bajus and Cici Malik treat the Iberian lyric in the late Middle Ages and early modernity as a deeply multilingual, transnational genre that needs to break away from the old essentialist ideas about language, geography and identity in order to be understood.

Strangers Within Francisco Bethencourt, 2024-03-26 The New Christians largely former Jews and Muslims who were forced to convert to Christianity in the 16th and 17th centuries were both a persecuted group as well as an international elite and their story argues Francisco Bethencourt offers a fascinating and indispensable view into the period and the making of a global economy In what is intended to be an authoritative and innovative book the author will recount how the New Christians were a major force in structuring the Atlantic economy and reconstruct their involvement in trading system which ran from the Atlantic to the Indian Ocean Their hybrid religious allegiances situated as they were primarily between Judaism and Christianity provide a unique case of cosmopolitanism in various parts of the world New Christian business practices forms of organisation and codes of behaviour linked intercontinental networks to local agencies Their ability to resist religious persecution implied alliances at the highest levels of the Catholic Church and the Iberian monarchies This book will provide entirely new perspectives for our understanding of cosmopolitanism religious allegiances political alliances and business history The New Christian trading elite has been studied in a fragmentary way compartmentalised in time and space but it has never been the subject of comprehensive research over the long term from

the forced conversion of the Jews in Portugal in 1497 to the abolition of the distinction between New Christians and Old Christians in Portugal in 1773 spanning connections between Europe Africa Asia and the New World

Inquisition, juifs et nouveaux-chrétiens au Brésil Bruno Feitler, 2003 Analyzes the situation of Conversos living in Pernambuco and Para ba between 1630 1756 from the Dutch conquest of these territories to the day when the last person incarcerated for Judaizing was released from prison Examines the activities of the Inquisition in Brazil as well as of the informers who denounced Crypto Jews The latter received privileges or material advantages Shows how the Inquisition found ways to provoke feelings of fear and or responsibility amongst the population which led them to denounce Judaizers Discusses also the attitudes of the Conversos to their Jewish heritage relates how hesitation and religious syncretism led to identity problems At first Christians Jews and Conversos lived together in harmony but the establishment of the Inquisition changed the relations between these groups

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
