Italian Women Writers from the Renaissance to the Present Maria Marotti, 2010-11-01 British Women Writers 1914-1945 Catherine Clay, 2017-09-20 Catherine Clay's persuasively argued and rigorously documented study examines women's friendships during the period between the two world wars Building on extensive new archival research the book's organizing principle is a series of literary historical case studies that explore the practices meanings and effects of friendship within a network of British women writers who were all loosely connected to the feminist weekly periodical *Time and Tide* Clay considers the letters and diaries as well as fiction poetry autobiographies and journalistic writings of authors such as

Vera Brittain Winifred Holtby Storm Jameson Naomi Mitchison and Stella Benson to examine women's friendships in relation to two key contexts: the rise of the professional woman writer under the shadow of literary modernism and historic shifts in the cultural recognition of lesbianism crystallized by *The Well of Loneliness* (1928). While Clay's study presents substantial evidence to support the crucial role close and enduring friendships played in women's professional achievements, it also boldly addresses the limitations and denials of these relationships. Producing biographies of friendship untold in existing author studies, her book also challenges dominant accounts of women's friendships and advances new ways for thinking about women's friendship in contemporary debates.

Korea Theresa Hyun, 2003-09-30 *Writing Women in Korea* explores the connections among translation, new forms of writing, and new representations of women in Korea from the early 1900s to the late 1930s. It examines shifts in the way translators handled material pertaining to women, the work of women translators of the time, and the relationship between translation and the original works of early twentieth-century Korean women writers. The book opens with an outline of the Chosŏn period (1392-1910), when a vernacular writing system was invented, making it possible to translate texts into Korean. In particular, Chinese writings reinforcing official ideals of feminine behavior aimed at women, the legends of European heroines, and foreign literary works such as those by Ibsen translated at the beginning of the twentieth century helped spur the creation of the New Woman (Sin Yŏng) ideal for educated women of the 1920s and 1930s. The role of women translators is explored as well as the scope of their work and the constraints they faced as translators. Finally, the author relates the writing of Kim Myŏng-sun, Pak Hwa-sŏng, and Mo Yun-suk to new trends imported into Korea through translation. She argues that these women deserve recognition for not only their creation of new forms of writing but also their contributions to Korea's emerging sense of herself as a modern and independent nation.

Despite benefiting from a rich body of scholarship and diverse critical practices, early modern women's writing is still treated as an optional or secondary component of Renaissance literary studies as a whole. In this book, Dodds and Dowd offer a state-of-the-field assessment of the critical and theoretical debates that have resulted in this state of affairs in order to advance specific visions for the future. Dodds and Dowd examine how perennial questions about authorship, canon, and literary value have historically influenced scholarship on early modern women's writing and its place within literary studies. Early modern women's writing has been perceived as belated, out of sync with dominant critical trends. Dodds and Dowd show the belatedness of early modern women's writing to be a happy accident that positions women's writing as a resource for the renewal of literary history. In both the classroom and in scholarship, early modern women's writing shows the way forward for the field, whether in the revitalization of formalist approaches to literature through an alliance with feminism or in the integration of newer critical methodologies such as premodern critical race studies. This book demonstrates that a feminist literary history that places women's writing at its center is essential to the future of English Renaissance literary studies. There is, in other words, no history of English Renaissance literature without women writers.
