

Haynes, 2017-08-31 A study of the scientist in Western culture from medieval images of alchemists to present day depictions of cyberpunks and genetic engineers. They were mad of course Or evil Or godless amoral arrogant impersonal and inhuman At best they were well intentioned but blind to the dangers of forces they barely controlled. They were Faust Frankenstein Jekyll Moreau Caligari Strangelove the scientists of film and fiction cultural archetypes that reflected ancient fears of tampering with the unknown or unleashing the little understood powers of nature. In From Madman to Crime Fighter Roslynn D. Haynes analyzes stereotypical characters including the mad scientist the cold blooded pursuer of knowledge the intrepid pathbreaker and the bumbling fool that from medieval times to the present day have been used to depict the scientist in Western literature and film She also describes more realistically drawn scientists characters who are conscious of their public responsibility to expose dangers from pollution and climate change yet fearful of being accused of lacking evidence.
