to bridge the gap from his academic post to wide popular success Elkin continued to write essays stories and novels that garnered unerring praise His was a classic dilemma of an intellectual aesthete loath to make use of the common devices of popular appeal The book details the ambition the success the friction and the foibles of a writer who won fame but not the fame he wanted
