Art and Social Theory. Sociological arguments in Aesthetics

Con esta obra, Austin Harrington logra la nada făcil tarea de resumir lo más relevante de la sociología del arte de los últimos dos siglos. Una somera lectura del indice muestra que estamos ante un amplio tratamiento de los temas sociológicos más importantes. La estética kantiana, la relación entre el arte y la política (en sus diversas vertientes sociológicas, humanistas, feministas y hasta post-colonialistas), la cultura de masas, el modernismo y los discursos de la posmodernidad, pasando por las diversas «muertes del arte», el idealismo y la utopia, encuentran aqui una muy estimulante y concisa elaboración; lo que sin duda hace de esta obra una de las más didácticas introducciones a tan compleja disciplina como es la sociología del

Pero quizás «sociología del arte» no sea aqui el término más apropiado, pues sin duda una de las virtudes más destacables del estudio de Harrington es su escepticismo hacia toda «teoria» que pueda subordinar el valor autónomo de la obra de arte. El texto no aborda el arte como teoría social, sino más bien aborda el arte y la teoría social del arte. La matización es pertinente, toda vez que apunta a una interpretación del arte de forma plural, tanto en su historia como en su sociologia, pero reservando siempre un grado suficiente de autonomía a la tarea del artista y a su obra misma. Así, para Harrington, el arte no se analiza satisfactoriamente como mero resultado de convenciones sociales, aun cuando, sin duda, estas convenciones o «teorías» podrán siempre aportar múltiples posibilidades interpretativas. El arte es más bien entendido como «fuente de conocimiento existencial y social cuyo valor es propio pero nunca inferior al contenido de las ciencias sociales» (p. 3). Afirma Harrington que el valor del arte es sui

generis y «la teoría social no puede por si misma generar juicios estéticos sobre obras de arte»; es capaz de «analizar e interpretar el valor, mas no puede por si misma fundamentarlo» (p. 3). Asimismo, marca una clara diferenciación entre concepciones metafisicas (aquéllas que «no pueden ser satisfechas en una determinada realidad socio-histórica sin alcanzar conclusiones distorsionadas y excluyentes») y las sociológicas, aquéllas que abordan los requisitos materiales e ideológicos de la obra en un contexto histórico determinado. Será esta última categoría la que nos ocupe a continuación.

Tras su introducción, el libro comienza elaborando el espinoso tema del valor estético de la obra del arte entendido como valor político. A través del trabajo de autores como Geroge Dickie o Arthur Danto, Harrington desarrolla una concepción del objeto de arte como valor institucional atribuido por una autoridad política determinada, y examina las condiciones bajo las que el calificativo de «obra de arte» pueda ser aceptado socialmente. Pasando a una crítica socialista convencional, Harrington no niega el concepto de la obra como receptáculo ideológico o como expresión de los intereses dominantes (postura adoptada, entre tantos, por Janet Wolf o John Berger en su ya clásico Ways of Seeing), pero si asegura que estas posiciones tienden a reducir la creación como mero resultado de las relaciones sociales de producción. Como bien aclara, el problema imperante en estas aproximaciones sigue siendo su limitación a la hora de explicar las enormes diferencias cualitativas existentes entre aquellas obra que incluso respondan a los mismos intereses o condiciones de producción.

En esta linea Harrington identificará tres limitaciones fundamentales en la crítica marxis-
