the lack of documentation and its endangered status This work is based on the author's personal fieldwork conducted between 1995 and 2002 and it consists of three parts Part I contains a thorough description of the phonology and morphosyntax of the language and a concise overview of its social cultural and historical context Part II contains a diverse selection of transcribed and translated texts with interlinear morphological analyses Part III is a dictionary of Kwaza including many examples and an English Kwaza register This complete description is of interest to linguists in general scholars of South American languages in particular and anthropologists and historians interested in the Guapor region
