Alfred Döblins historisches Denken Adalbert Wichert,2016-12-12 **The Critical Reception of Alfred Döblin's Major Novels** Wulf Köpke,2003 The first thorough study in English of the reception of Döblin's novels written by one of the foremost Döblin scholars Alfred Döblin 1878 1957 is one of the major German writers of the twentieth century His experimental ever changing avant garde style kept both readers and critics off guard and although he won the acclaim of critics and had a clear impact on German writers after the Second World War Günter Grass called him my teacher he is still largely unknown to the reading public and under researched by literary scholars He was a prolific writer with thirteen novels alongside a great many other shorter fiction works and non-fiction writings to his credit and yet paradoxically he is known to a larger public as the author of only one book the 1929 novel Berlin Alexanderplatz which sold more copies in the first weeks of publication than all his previous novels combined Alexanderplatz is known for its depiction of the criminal underground of Berlin and a montage and stream of consciousness technique comparable to James Joyce's Ulysses it became one of the best known big city novels of the century and has remained Döblin's one enduring popular success Döblin was forced into exile in 1933 and the works he wrote in exile were neglected by critics for decades Now epic works like Amazonas November 1918 and Hamlet Oder die lange Nacht nimmt ein Ende are finding a fairer critical evaluation Wulf Koepke tackles the paradox of Döblin the leading but neglected avant gardist by analysis of contemporary and later criticism both journalistic and academic always taking into account the historical context in which it appeared Wulf Koepke is Professor Emeritus at Texas A M University Nietzsche and Jewish Culture Jacob Golomb,2002-01-04 Friedrich Nietzsche occupies a contradictory position in the history of ideas he came up with the concept of a master race yet an eminent Jewish scholar like Martin Buber translated his Also sprach Zarathustra into Polish and remained in a lifelong intellectual dialogue with Nietzsche Sigmund Freud admired his intellectual courage and was not at all reluctant to admit that Nietzsche had anticipated many of his basic ideas This unique collection of essays explores the reciprocal relationship between Nietzsche and Jewish culture It is organized in two parts the first examines Nietzsche's attitudes towards Jews and Judaism the second Nietzsche's influence on Jewish intellectuals as diverse and as famous as Franz Kafka Martin Buber Franz Rosenzweig and Sigmund Freud Each carefully selected essay explores one aspect of Nietzsche's relation to Judaism and German intellectual history from Heinrich Heine to Nazism A Companion to the Works of Alfred Döblin Roberta L. D blin's texts which range widely across contemporary discourses are paradigms of the encounter between literary and scientific modernity With their use of Tatsachenphantasie they explode conventional language seeking a new connection with the world of objects and things This volume reassesses and reevaluates the uniquely interdisciplinary quality of D blin's interdiscursive factually inspired poetics by offering challenging new perspectives on key works The volume analyses not only some of D blin's best known novels and stories but also neglected works including his early medical essays political journalism and autobiographical texts Other topics addressed are D blin's engagement with German history his relation to medical discourse his topography of Berlin his aestheticisation of his own biography and his relation to other major writers such as Heine Benn Brecht and Sebald With contributions in English and in German by scholars from Germany and the United Kingdom the volume presents insights into D blin that are of value to advanced researchers and to students

Kontext der europäischen Avantgarde Mitidieri, Gaetano, 2016-12-12 Ziel dieser Studie ist es die bislang nur sporadisch untersuchten Wechselverhältnisse zwischen den Kulturbereichen Wissenschaft, Technik und Literatur am herausragenden Beispiel des Oeuvres des Schriftstellers und Arztes Alfred Döblin aufzuspüren. Hierbei scheint seine rechtlich psychiatrische Laufbahn die eine breite Grundlage wissenschaftlicher Diskurse anzubieten wie auch seine avantgardistische Literaturpraxis diese gegenseitige Befruchtung gefordert zu haben. Im Hinblick auf den Forschungsgegenstand und Zweck ist ein kulturwissenschaftlicher Ansatz versucht worden. Dieser vielperspektivische Ansatz der von der Prämisse eines Wechselspiels aller Kulturbereiche untereinander ausgeht gestattet eine dem Gegenstand angepasste Verknüpfung von verschiedenen Arbeitsmethoden wie der philologisch literarhistorischen mit der konstruktivistischen und der komparatistischen. Hierbei ist eine Einbeziehung wissenschafts- und technikphilosophischer Reflexion wie auch einer dementsprechend erweiterte kulturhistorische Kontextualisierung vorgenommen worden. English summary The topos of Europe's lingering illness is omnipresent in Alfred Döblin's novel *Amazonas*. The novel portrays the course of European modernism as the history of a disease breaking out in the Age of Discovery and reaching its catastrophic climax in the barbarity of Fascism. Exaggerated rationalism, materialism and nihilism culminate in an excessive will to power and rule and senseless, crazy self destruction. Europe and the Europeans seem to be denied any alternative. This diagnosis made with pen and paper by the doctor and writer Döblin is crushing but not final. Taking Döblin's poetological, cultural, philosophical and anthropological writings into account, Vera Hildenbrandt sees *Amazonas* as a laboratory in which Döblin gets to the root of the disease of his time by examining Europe and Europeans in different epochs and from numerous different angles. Historical fiction from the epic tales of the ancients to *Gone With the Wind* and *Roots* demonstrates an inherent need in man to come to terms with his heritage in literary form When the writers and readers are exiles their need becomes especially poignant The dual historical artistic nature of the historical novel legitimates its claim to be a distinct genre Two of the post 1933 exiled German novelists Lion Feuchtwanger and Alfred D blin saw the historical novel s function as to collect preserve and transmit the reality not the mere facts of great historical events and personages The analysis of a cross section of the work of these two and eight other leading German novelists in exile Thomas and Heinrich Mann Hermann Broch Wolfgang Cordan Bruno Frank Robert Neumann Edgar Maass and Joseph Roth confirms the view of D blin and Feuchtwanger and reveals that an indebtedness to Neo Romanticism and a basic humanist attitude are common to all the authors Although 1933 marks the largest migration of writers into exile known to modern history their experience and their subsequent novels share attributes with the fictional expressions of exiled writers from places as varied as Argentina Poland South Africa and the Soviet Union ***Das Ich und die Natur*** Christoph Bartscherer, 1997 ***Internationales Alfred-Döblin-Kolloquium***
