The disillusionment of scholars and nonscholars alike who conclude that democracy in the United States has failed calls for an innovative examination of our democratic processes Kim Quaile Hill arguing that these critics have been too hasty in their judgment presents the first comprehensive assessment on the extent of achieved democratization He examines the range of representative democracy in the states by comparing them on the key components of democracy indicated in empirical democratic theory equal rights to vote competitiveness among political parties and the degree of mass participation Building on empirical democratic theory and scholarship in comparative state politics Hill follows the tradition of prominent cross national studies to develop this intranational analysis of democratic processes These analyses provide considerable evidence

Smith, 2016-11-11 This book offers a case study of the George M Leader administration in Pennsylvania 1955-1959 with particular reference to the administrative rather than the political changes that took place during that period Governor Leader was more active in the reorganization of the central staff services in Pennsylvania than any governor since the 1920s The most significant changes resulted from the establishment of an Office of Administration within the governor's office This department embraced a number of staff and operating functions including central budgeting and program evaluation Over half the text is concerned with the new function of program evaluation which the Leader administration treated as a basic administrative process requiring a structure and identity separate from that of the other staff functions The author also discusses the traditional nature of the governorship in Pennsylvania noting the changes that took place as a result of the political and administrative transition in 1955 These changes were in the form of personnel brought into the state service at all levels the extension of civil service by executive order the use of patronage removal power executive clemency and other fiscal and personnel reforms Other significant state issues discussed by the author include the use of advisory groups the nature of the governor's cabinet and staff the role of egg heads in government the merit system and its extension in a strong patronage situation and fiscal policy *State Government in Transition* is not only a valuable addition to the literature on state government it is also a book of great practical value particularly for the political scientist student government worker or politician An appendix with a comparative chart of the governors of Pennsylvania under the Constitution of 1874 which is still in effect and an organizational chart of the governor's office in 1960 supplement the text

Dubois, 2014-07-03 Over several decades many U S states abandoned the practice of selecting their judges by direct popular election and adopted the Missouri Plan of judicial selection In *From Ballot to Bench* Philip L. Dubois subjects the various criticisms raised against judicial elections to a more searching scrutiny than previously has been attempted Dubois carefully reviews the three central

counts on which judicial elections have been faulted for lowering the quality of the bench for impairing judicial independence and for failing to secure judicial accountability After concluding that the potential for judicial elections to hold judges popularly accountable is what might commend them over alternative selection methods Dubois concentrates on the analysis of empirical evidence to evaluate judicial elections as mechanisms of accountability The study examines all the statewide partisan and nonpartisan elections for state supreme court justices in non southern states from 1948 to 1974 Included is a detailed examination of voter participation electoral competition the behavior of judicial electorates and the patterns of gubernatorial vacancy appointments An analysis of decision making on eight state supreme courts also tests the relationship between different selection systems and judicial behavior Dubois finds that partisan elections maximize voter participation meaningfully structure voter choices minimize accession to the bench by appointment and allow popular control over gubernatorial appointments Additional evidence on the extent of partisan voting by judges selected under different methods leads Dubois to conclude that partisan elections are superior to both nonpartisan elections and nonelective selection methods as instruments of accountability The importance of the questions addressed the breadth of the data collected and the unorthodox conclusions offered make this a significant book for political scientists judges lawyers and public officials

Horses In Midstream Andrew E. Busch, 1999-08-15 Horses in Midstream breaks the mold of midterm election literature by focusing on the consequences of midterm elections rather than on the causes of the anti administration pattern of those elections The book concludes that the midterm pattern has two primary consequences it stymies the President and provides an opportunity for the revitalization of the opposition party and that numerical losses by the President's party is really only a small part of the equation Consequently midterm elections can be considered an additional check in the U S political system acting as a mechanism that helps to assure rough two party balance In examining the historical results from midterm elections dating back to 1894 and extending to the surprising result of 1994 and 1998 Busch has uncovered seven consistent ways in which the president and his party are harmed by midterm elections These elections unfavorably alter the composition of congress both between the parties and within the President's own party they deprive the President of the plebiscitary power derived from his original electoral mandate they give an intangible sense of momentum to the opposition party leading to renewed opportunities for the opposition to put forward new leaders and to develop winning issues they exacerbate splits within the President's own party and they provide the opposition party with expanded party building opportunities at the state level Busch also places the midterm elections into four categories preparatory midterms which contribute to a subsequent change in party control of the Presidency calibrating midterms in which voters slow but do not reverse extraordinary periods of Presidentially driven change normal midterms when midterm elections stymie the President without contributing to a White House takeover and the rare creative exceptions when an administration escapes the midterm curse at the polls and find themselves invigorated rather than weakened Busch's new approach to midterm elections his well

supported conclusions and his clear consistent style will certainly be of interest to political scientists and will translate well to the classroom
