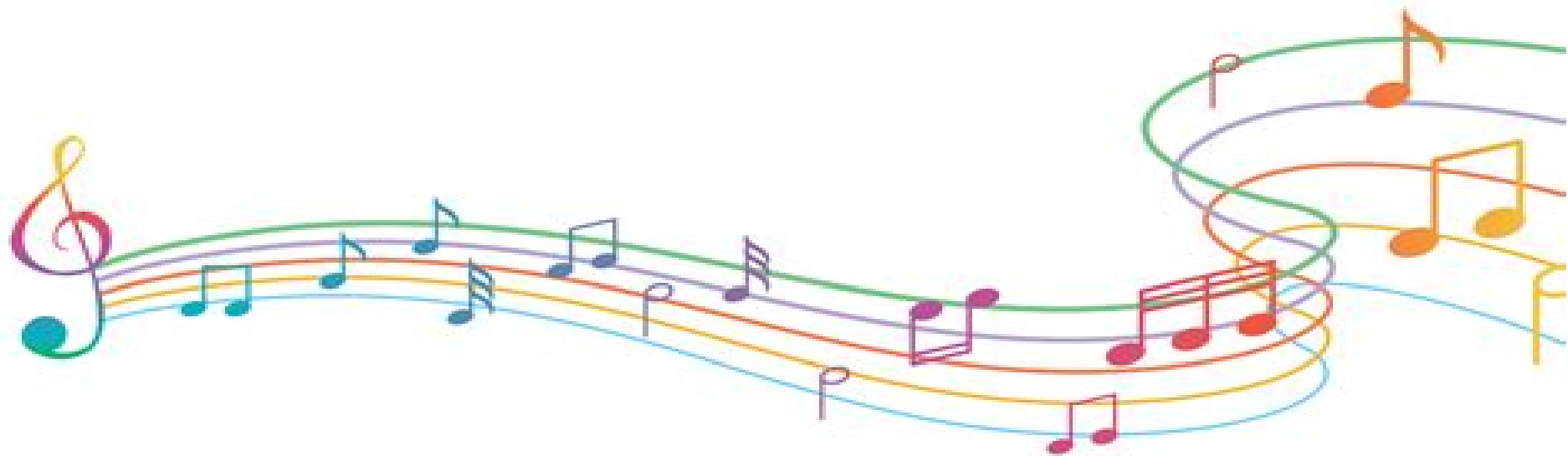

The Book of Lieder Ian Bostridge, Richard Stokes, 2011-03-03 This unique volume contains in parallel translation a thousand of the most frequently performed Lieder both piano accompanied and orchestral Composers are arranged alphabetically with their songs appearing under poet in chronological order of composition thus allowing the reader to engage in depth with a particular poet and at the same time to follow the composer's development Richard Stokes whose work in this field is already widely acclaimed provides illuminating short essays on each of the fifty composers approach to Lieder composition as well as notes on all the poets who inspired the songs The volume is notable for the accuracy and elegance of its translations and for its fidelity to the German verse every care has been taken to print the words of the sung text while adhering to the versification and punctuation of the original poem Beethoven Schubert and Schumann Goethe Heine and Schiller are among the highlights of a book which illuminates one of the great musical traditions and will be an indispensable handbook for every music lover *Song on Record: Volume 1, Lieder* Alan Blyth, 1986-10-23 A history of the Lied and its interpretation with a guide to available recordings *Romantic Lieder and the Search for Lost Paradise* Marjorie Wing Hirsch, 2007 This book examines the theme of lost paradise in Lieder by nineteenth century composers including Franz Schubert **Hugo Wolf and his Mörike Songs** Susan Youens, 2000-06-22 Viennese composer Hugo Wolf produced one of the most important song collections of the nineteenth century when he set to music fifty three poems by the great German poet Eduard Mörike Susan Youens reappraises this singular collaboration to shed new light on the sophisticated interplay between poetry and music in the songs Wolf is customarily described as the Poet's Composer someone who revered poetry and served it faithfully in his music Yet as Youens reveals this cliché overlooks the rich terrain in which his songs are often at cross purposes with his chosen poetry Although Wolf did much to draw the world's attention to the neglected Swabian poet his musical interpretation of the poetry was also influenced by his own life psychology and experiences This book examines selected Mörike songs in detail demonstrating that the poems and music each have their own distinctive stories which at times intersect but also diverge **Schubert's Lieder and the Philosophy of Early German Romanticism** Dr Lisa Feurzeig, 2014-02-28 This study of Franz Schubert's settings of poetry by Friedrich Schlegel and Novalis introduces the fascinating world of early German Romanticism in the 1790s when an energetic group of bold young thinkers radically changed the landscape of European thought Schubert's encounters with early Romantic poetry some twenty years later reanimated some of the movement's central ideas Schubert set eleven texts from Schlegel's *Abendröte* poetic cycle and six poems drawn from Novalis religious and erotic poetry Through detailed analyses of how various musical structures in these songs mirror and sometimes even explicate the central ideas of the poems this book argues that Schubert was an abstract thinker who used his medium of music to diagram the complex ideas of a highly intellectual movement A comparison is made to the hermeneutic theory of that time primarily that of Schleiermacher who was himself linked to the

early Romantics Through exploration of ideas such as Schlegel's representation of the necessary interdependence of part and whole and Novalis' strong association of religious and erotic experience along with their musical representations by Schubert this book opens an intriguing world of thought for modern readers At the same time Feurzeig explores some of Schubert's little known songs which range from quirky to charming to exquisite *Death in Winterreise* Lauri Suurpää, 2014-01-06

Lauri Suurpää brings together two rigorous methodologies Greimassian semiotics and Schenkerian analysis to provide a unique perspective on the expressive power of Franz Schubert's song cycle Focusing on the final songs Suurpää deftly combines textual and tonal analysis to reveal death as a symbolic presence if not actual character in the musical narrative Suurpää demonstrates the incongruities between semantic content and musical representation as it surfaces throughout the final songs This close reading of the winter songs coupled with creative applications of theory and a thorough history of the poetic and musical genesis of this work brings new insights to the study of text music relationships and the song cycle *The life of Franz Schubert* Heinrich Kreissle, 1869 *Franz Schubert* Graham Johnson, 2014-12-16

Beginning several generations before Schubert the Lied first appears as domestic entertainment In the century that follows it becomes one of the primary modes of music making By the time German song comes to its presumed conclusion with Richard Strauss's 1948 *Vier letzte Lieder* this rich repertoire has moved beyond the home and keyboard accompaniment to the symphony hall This is a 2004 introductory chronicle of this fascinating genre In essays by eminent scholars this Companion places the Lied in its full context at once musical literary and cultural with chapters devoted to focal composers as well as important issues such as the way in which the Lied influenced other musical genres its use as a musical commodity and issues of performance The volume is framed by a detailed chronology of German music and poetry from the late 1730s to the present and also contains a comprehensive bibliography *Wagner Outside the Ring* John Louis DiGaetani, 2009-10-21

Designed as a companion volume to 2006's *Inside the Ring* which focused on the four operas comprising Richard Wagner's *Der Ring des Nibelungen* this new volume features more than a dozen original essays focusing on all of Wagner's non Ring operas Part One looks at the individual operas including *Der Fliegende Holländer* *Tannhäuser* *Lohengrin* *Tristan und Isolde* *Die Meistersinger von Nürnberg* and *Parsifal* Part Two reveals the connections between Wagnerian opera and other arts including dance filmmaking and fiction Finally Part Three examines Wagner's operas in performance featuring interviews with mezzo soprano

Michelle DeYoung and heldentenor Ben Heppner both well known for their Wagnerian performances The book includes many photographs from current productions by the Metropolitan Opera and other opera companies along with bibliographies and a discography of recommended performances

David Tunley,2014-03-18 First Published in 1995 This title is volume 4 in a series comprising nearly 300 romances and melodies most of which were composed during the 40 years that saw a blossoming of the romantic spirit in all the arts in France The composers represented in this volume were of a rather serious turn of musical mind and many of the songs presented seem to have enjoyed the more sheltered success of the private recital to which the critics may not have been invited

State ,1990 The Mahler Companion Donald Mitchell,Andrew Nicholson,2002 The Mahler Companion consists of a collection of original essays on Mahler written especially for the occasion by Mahler specialists from around the world It addresses all parts of his life and work symphonies songs and song cycles each of which is discussed individually his conducting activities compositional habits and aesthetic development and sets these within the cultural and political context of his time In addition it responds to the global spread of this remarkable composer's music and an almost universal fascination with it by attempting to give an account of the reception of Mahler's music in many of the countries in which it eventually came to flourish eg Holland France Japan Russia England and the United States This particular series of chapters reveals that the Mahler Phenomenon earned its description principally in the years after the Second World War but also that the Mahler revival was already well under way pre war perhaps especially in England and the States and most surprisingly of all Japan The selection of contributors who between them cover all Mahler's musical output shows that here too this volume significantly crosses national boundaries The very diverse approaches analyses and commentaries amply illustrated with music examples are evidence of the uniquely rich and complex character of a music that spans more than one culture and more than one century The volumes includes the most significant and up to date Mahler research and debate and illumines some hitherto unexplored areas of Mahler's life eg his visit to London in 1892 his sculptor daughter Anna and the hall in which the Seventh Symphony was first performed in Prague in 1908 It has often been claimed that Mahler born in 1860 was in fact a prophet of much that was to come in the 20th century His later works undeniably anticipate often with dazzling virtuosity many of the principal techniques and aesthetics of the new century only the first decade of which he lived to see Small wonder that among his earliest admirers was a collective of some of the most important and innovative composers of our time Schoenberg Berg and Webern Their successors Copland Shostakovich and Britten to name a few were to range across contrasting cultures and national frontiers Drawing on the best resources and the most up to date information about the composer this volume fulfils the need in Mahler literature for a genuinely comprehensive guide to the composer and will

be the authoritative guide for Mahler enthusiasts for years to come

The Symphonic Repertoire, Volume IV A. Peter Brown, 2024-03-29 Central to the repertoire of Western art music since the 18th century the symphony has come to be regarded as one of the ultimate compositional challenges Surprisingly heretofore there has been no truly extensive broad based treatment of the genre and the best of the existing studies are now several decades old In this five volume series A Peter Brown explores the symphony from its 18th century beginnings to the end of the 20th century Synthesizing the enormous scholarly literature Brown presents up to date overviews of the status of research discusses any important former or remaining problems of attribution illuminates the style of specific works and their contexts and samples early writings on their reception The Symphonic Repertoire provides an unmatched compendium of knowledge for the student teacher performer and sophisticated amateur The series is being launched with two volumes on the Viennese symphony Volume IV The Second Golden Age of the Viennese Symphony Brahms Bruckner Dvor k Mahler and Selected Contemporaries Although during the mid 19th century the geographic center of the symphony in the Germanic territories moved west and north from Vienna to Leipzig during the last third of the century it returned to the old Austrian lands with the works of Brahms Bruckner Dvor k and Mahler After nearly a half century in hibernation the sleeping Viennese giant awoke to what some viewed as a reincarnation of Beethoven with the first hearing of Brahms s Symphony No 1 which was premiered at Vienna in December 1876 Even though Bruckner had composed some gigantic symphonies prior to Brahms s first contribution their full impact was not felt until the composer s complete texts became available after World War II Although Dvor k was often viewed as a nationalist composer in his symphonic writing his primary influences were Beethoven Schubert and Brahms For both Bruckner and Mahler the symphony constituted the heart of their output for Brahms and Dvor k it occupied a less central place Yet for all of them the key figure of the past remained Beethoven The symphonies of these four composers together with the works of Goldmark Zemlinsky Schoenberg Berg Smetana Fibich Jan cek and others are treated in Volume IV The Second Golden Age of the Viennese Symphony covering the period from roughly 1860 to 1930

Bridal-quest Epics in Medieval Germany Sarah Bowden, 2012 K nig Rother Salman und Morolf the M nchner Oswald and Grauer Rock otherwise known as Orendel have had a troubled position in the literary history of medieval Germany Forced into a normative generic framework as either Minstrel Epic Spielmannsepik or Bridal quest Epic Brautwerbungsepik these texts have been viewed conventionally according to an essentially teleological classification or a schematic ideal Bowden challenges the premises of such a view with a detailed history of the textual scholarship and reevaluates these so called Bridal quests on their own terms offering detailed and suggestive readings of each work without the distortions or limitations inherent in the traditional interpretative model Sarah Bowden is Powys Roberts Research Fellow at St Hugh s College Oxford
