Patrick Ober, 2003 Mark Twain has always been America's spokesman and his comments on a wide range of topics continue to be accurate valid and frequently amusing His opinions on the medical field are no exception While Twain's works including his popular novels about Tom Sawyer and Huckleberry Finn are rich in medical imagery and medical themes derived from his personal experiences his interactions with the medical profession and his comments about health illness and physicians have largely been overlooked In *Mark Twain and Medicine* K Patrick Ober remedies this omission The nineteenth century was a critical time in the development of American medicine with much competition among the different systems of health care both traditional and alternative Not surprisingly Mark Twain was right in the middle of it all He experimented with many of the alternative care systems that were available in his day in part because of his frustration with traditional medicine and in part because he hoped to find the perfect system that would bring health to his family Twain's commentary provides a unique perspective on American medicine and the revolution in medical systems that he experienced firsthand Ober explores Twain's personal perspective in this area as he expressed it in fiction speeches and letters As a medical educator Ober explains in sufficient detail and with clarity all medical and scientific terms making this volume accessible to the general reader Ober demonstrates that many of Twain's observations are still relevant to today's health care issues including the use of alternative or complementary medicine in dealing with illness the utility of placebo therapies and the role of hope in the

healing process Twain's evaluation of the medical practices of his era provides a fresh humanistic and personalized view of the dramatic changes that occurred in medicine through the nineteenth century and into the first decade of the twentieth Twain scholars general readers and medical professionals will all find this unique look at his work appealing

The Pawnee Mythology George Amos Dorsey, 1997-01-01 The Pawnee Mythology originally published in 1906 preserves 148 tales of the Pawnee Indians who farmed and hunted and lived in earth covered lodges along the Platte River in Nebraska The stories collected from surviving members of four bands Skidi Pitahaurat Kitkehahki and Chaui were generally told during intermissions of sacred ceremonies Many were accompanied by music George A Dorsey recorded these Pawnee myths early in the twentieth century after the tribe's traumatic removal from their ancestral homeland to Oklahoma He included stories of instruction concerning supernatural beings the importance of revering such gifts as the buffalo and corn and the results of violating nature Hero tales forming another group usually centered on a poor boy who overcame all odds to benefit the tribe Other tales invited good fortune recognized wonderful beings like the witch women and spider women and explained the origin of medicine powers Coyote tales were meant to amuse while teaching ethics George A Dorsey 1868 1931 was a distinguished anthropologist and journalist who also wrote about the traditions of the Arapahos Arikaras and Osages Douglas R Parks is a professor of anthropology and associate director of the American Indian Studies Research Institute at Indiana University He is the editor of James R Murie's Ceremonies of the Pawnee Nebraska 1989 and the editor and translator of Myths and Traditions of the Arikara Indians Nebraska 1996
