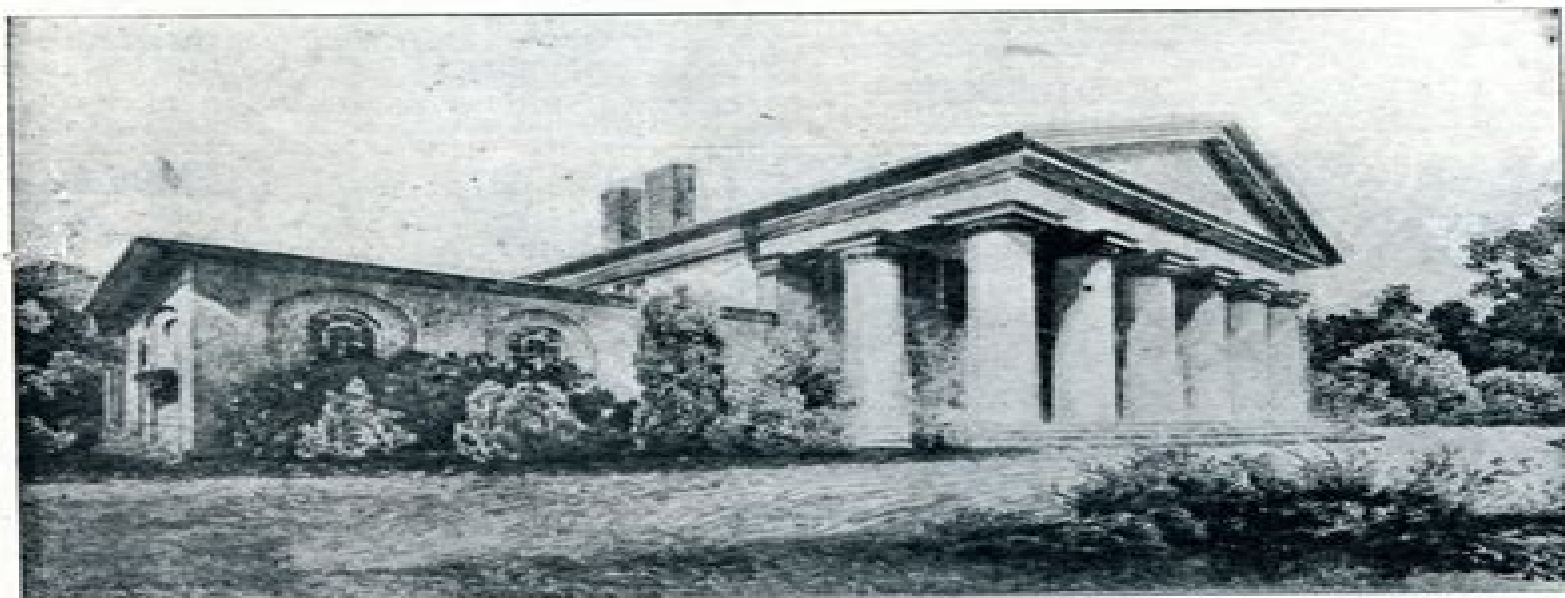

McKinney,2016-02-18 In June 1864 General Ulysses Grant ordered his cavalry commander Philip Sheridan to conduct a raid to destroy the Virginia Central Railroad between Charlottesville and Richmond Sheridan fell short of his objective when he was defeated by General Wade Hampton s cavalry in a two day battle at Trevilian Station The first day s fighting saw dismounted Yankees and Rebels engaged at close range in dense forest By day s end Hampton had withdrawn to the west Advancing the next morning Sheridan found Hampton dug in behind hastily
