Ahadada Reader I John Byrum, Alan Halsey, Geraldine Monk, 2004 Poetry The AHADADA READER I combines the lively challenging work of three experimental poets Alan Halsey John Byrum and Geraldine Monk Halsey's group of poems resurrects past versions of English turning with peculiar spellings and striking frictions of their grammar Byrum s work entitled Approximations is a shifting visual text work mainly utilizing the text block pointing to the form of a word as art itself The final selection of Monk's work rounds out the book with her varying forms and sharply constructed lines Fox, 2005 Poetry Skip Fox with the concern of an entomologist presents passages sprawling and pinned in a shadow box of observations and odd lots Framed under double glass the mounting board of AT THAT writhes with a cast of freaks Ezekiel in the streets a kitty bomb squad sadists on steroids the shadow of Cadmus kingfishers omen clad apertures of evening with cicada wings heart attacks of clouds rolling in off the Gulf a city mouse spastic proctologists and so forth all projecting their goods in spate smatterings obsolete creeds mordacious stumps furious opinions exaggerations fabrications neo prophetic stylings verbal molestations elegiac mumblings the silence above a shallow grave etc Currently serving what appears to be a life sentence at the University of Louisiana at Lafayette Skip Fox has worked in woods warehouses shake and shingle mills lumber yards ketchup catfood factories mental hospitals and so on Obsession Carolyn Beard Whitlow, Marilyn Krysl, 2014-03-04 The sestina of medieval French origin is a complex poetic form of 39 lines six sestets and a three line envoy in which the six end words teleutons of the lines of the first sestet stanza are repeated in a specific order as teleutons in the five succeeding sestets In the envoy the six teleutons are again picked up one of them being buried in and one finishing each line Because of the complexity of the form the sestina fell out of favor with poets for several decades However a twenty first century revival of the form is underway This is the first anthology of sestinas that showcases both traditional and innovative examples of the form by modern and contemporary poets award winners and emerging writers alike Organized by such themes as Americana Art Love and Sex and Memory Contemplation Retrospection and Death the collection also includes sestinas with irregular teleutons and unconventional sestinas An evocative introduction by Marilyn Krysl acquaints readers with the form The volume concludes with useful indexes of first lines and teleutons increasing access to the poems beyond the poets names Secret, But Kept it Room Mike Gubser, 2005 Poetry SECRET BUT KEPT IT ROOM explores the development and stasis over time of self as image at once real and artificial subjective and perspectival engaged in the physical world and torn from it a self often disappearing into non self Mike Gubser treats the art of poetry as in some sense the art of experiment and problem solving by placing the notion of self in various contexts romance depression friendship travel memory isolation and poetic forms visual musical lyrical modernist numeric to see how it reacts Mike Gubser has published various chapbooks and a book on turn of the century Austria entitled Time s Visible Surface Alois Riegl and the Discourse on History and Temporality in fin de siecle Austria Presently he is a history professor at James Madison University

in Virginia Before then he worked as a high school teacher a writer for an international development organization an instructor at San Quentin Penitentiary and an English teacher in Czechoslovakia China Notes & the Treasures of Dunhuang Jerome Rothenberg, 2006 Poetry The China Notes come from a trip in 2002 that brought us out as far as the Gobi Desert allowed me to see some of the changes continuities throughout the country I was traveling with poet scholar Wai lim Yip had a chance to read poetry in five or six cities to observe things as part of an ongoing discourse with Wai lim others The ancient beauty of some of what we saw played out against the theme park quality of other simulacra of the past A sense of beckoning wilderness wildness in a landscape already cut into to serve the human need for power control So Jerome Rothenberg describes the events behind the poems in this small volume a continuation of his lifelong exploration of poetry and the search for a language to invoke the newness and strangeness both of what we observe and what we can imagine □□□□□□□□□□ Kikuko Otake,2007 <u>Lives of the Poets</u> Alan Halsey, 2009 Poetry This new book by Alan Halsey comprises 191 poems of the lives of British poets Each Life is a poem distilled in a few highly concentrated lines and a life may be revealed in a tiny concatenation of phrase and fragment Pithy allusive and sympathetic the lives celebrate poets from Chaucer to Lionel Johnson The famous Wyatt W S Milton Pope two Coleridges two Brownings appear alongside the lesser known The result is a must read book by one of the best living British poets LIVES OF THE POETS is gorgeously produced by Five Seasons Halsey is the publisher of West House Books and the author of many books available from SPD the most recent of which is MARGINALIEN also by Five Seasons **Not Everything Remotely** Alan Halsey, 2006 Not Everything Remotely is the widest ranging gathering of Halsey's poems to date Some have not previously been published while many appeared in fugitive editions and collections now out of print It brings together poems which slowly developed into broadly related sequences such as the verse letters begun in 1979 as communiques from the Welsh border and continued into the 90s tracking the savageries of the Thatcher years It also collects his emblem poems in which traditional devices are reworked within the modernist perspective these and other short poems veer between political epigram and an Ars Poetica Of his recent work there is a selection from the sequence in progress A Looking Glass for Logoclasts Halsey's poems often draw on familiar forms of discourse such as the financial philosophical and journalistic set alongside the specialist and marginal vocabularies used in such studies as linguistics ufology and the paranormal they may or may not be a satire which is enacted in the absence of a validated hierarchy of discourse Tim Woods Poetry Project ,2002 The Richard Peabody **Reader** Richard Peabody, Michael Dirda, 2015-04-01 Filling an important gap in the literary world The Richard Peabody Reader is a wide ranging selection of this great writer s poetry and prose As a publisher Peabody's steadfast dedication to that which is new challenging innovative and dynamic has won him a wide reputation among writers whose work he has championed This volume demonstrates those same values embodied in nearly four decades of fiercely smart sophisticated and often very funny writing From his first collection of poems I m in Love with the Morton Salt Girl to his most recent
