Kirby-Welch, John Morton Lee, 2009 Charts Hardy's life and artistic career Russia & Europe in the Nineteenth Century Sphinx Fine Art, Edward Strachan, Roy Bolton, 2008 A Companion to Victorian and Edwardian Artists Adrian Vincent, 1991 This illustrated gallery of Victorian and Edwardian art contains entries on the life and work of more than 350 artists of the era **A Postcard History of the Passenger Liner** Christopher Deakes, 2023-10-01 From around 1880 for almost a hundred years shipowners commissioned a wealth of paintings that depicted their magnificent liners as well as the routes they travelled their exotic destinations and life onboard These paintings rich in imagination and atmosphere appeared on postcards and posters of the day and were used to advertise the companies and their ships and so was born a whole genre that produced tens of thousands of paintings which formed a wonderful record of the great era of the passenger liner In 1900 there were over thirty shipping companies operating passenger liners across the North Atlantic Other oceans were similarly served But now with just a few exceptions the companies and their liners have disappeared along with the art they once inspired Little remains to recall this aspect of our maritime past except the postcards and they tell an evocative story of the vanished world of elegant ships and leisurely travel of social and political times much changed by the history of the past century Here brought vividly to life in more than 500 colourful postcards are the ships on which so many of our predecessors sailed as emigrants soldiers administrators or simply as tourists in days long past These cards which are now highly collectable show how steamships developed over the years but they are also a fine tribute to the artists who painted them This volume also includes a glossary of some 170 illustrators which forms an important reference section and advice on collecting The Grove Encyclopedia of Materials and Techniques in Art Gerald W. Nelson, 2017-07-05 Slavery Geography and Empire in Nineteenth Century Marine Landscapes of Montreal and Jamaica is among the first Slavery Studies books and the first in Art History to juxtapose temperate and tropical slavery Charmaine A Nelson explores the central role of geography and its racialized representation as landscape art in imperial conquest One could easily assume that nineteenth century Montreal and Jamaica were worlds apart but through her astute examination of marine landscape art the author re connects these two significant British island colonies sites of

colonial ports with profound economic and military value Through an analysis of prints illustrated travel books and maps the author exposes the fallacy of their disconnection arguing instead that the separation of these colonies was a retroactive fabrication designed in part to rid Canada of its deeply colonial history as an integral part of Britain's global trading network which enriched the motherland through extensive trade in crops produced by enslaved workers on tropical plantations The first study to explore James Hakewill's Jamaican landscapes and William Clark's Antiguan genre studies in depth it also examines the Montreal landscapes of artists including Thomas Davies Robert Sproule George Heriot and James Duncan Breaking new ground Nelson reveals how gender and race mediated the aesthetic and scientific access of such mainly white male artists She analyzes this moment of deep political crisis for British slave owners between the end of the slave trade in 1807 and complete abolition in 1833 who employed visual culture to imagine spaces free of conflict and to alleviate their pervasive anxiety about slave resistance Nelson explores how vision and cartographic knowledge translated into authority which allowed colonizers to civilize the terrains of the so called New World while belying the oppression of slavery and indigenous displacement

George Back,1994 Arctic Artist is the liveliest and most complete account of Sir John Franklin s tragic first expedition to the Arctic George Back s prose captures the drama of the journey while his superb watercolour sketches reveal the beauty and wonder of this northern land Published for the first time this is the complete text of Back s journal Arctic Artist completes Stuart Houston s trilogy of the journals of Franklin s officers *THE REEVES FAMILY - MANUFACTURERS OF SUPERFINE WATER-COLOR PAINT IN THE REGENCY PERIOD* Jaap den Hollander (NL),2025-08-14 Abstract This study describes three antique watercolour boxes from Reeves with colors in cakes dating around 1800 A concise chronological overview shows which family members of the Reeves family and their associates lead the firm during the Regency period Old city maps of London indicate the various shop locations and a brief look is taken at early 18th century shops of color men and the production of watercolor paint in cakes The dating of the watercolour box and its contents raise a number of questions To position the box with contents in the correct period an overview of available trade cards is consulted Stamps on cakes are linked to the various family members who led the Reeves firm in the Regency period Based on the contents of comparable watercolour boxes relationships are established with user groups quality criteria of the paint and color theories in the 17th and 18th century An attempt has been made the 17th and 18th century colour theories in which light refraction the distinguishing of colours and physical laws are important to connect with pigments tinctures and mixing paint colours to make visual art works possible Overviews of pigments and paint tincture by a number of authoritative authors in the 17th and 18th centuries are highlighted The hidden selection rules of the colours and their conscious positioning in the boxes are discussed Instructional illustrated is the visually completing of the missing paint cakes Also included are some overviews of the selection of watercolour paint cakes in comparable boxes The restored boxes and their contents are illustrated in a number of images Finally each of the colour cakes in the boxes around 1799 1800 is treated by their description in the 18th century literature An extensive overview with mainly 17th and 18th century sources on pigments dyes paint preparation colour theories etc is affixed Added are contemporary authors who have written about the Reeves firm Finally nine attachments are available about a scheme of painting substances by Robert Dossie the management structure of the Reeves firm till the 20th century a pricelist of Robert Ackermann s paints in 1818 a text fragment in Ackermann s Repository of Arts 1813 a reconstructed advertisement text in the Derby Mercury of April 10 1794 a recipe for a binding mixture to make watercolour cakes an article about an other way of making watercolour cakes of dough text from W T Whitley about Artists and their Friends in England during the Regency period and a list of authorities in the 18th century literature on colours in the form of tinctures based on natural resources and natural solvents and binders Last update August 2025
