The First Presidential Contest Jeffrey L. Pasley, 2016-12-04 This is the first study in half a century to focus on the election of 1796 At first glance the first presidential contest looks unfamiliar parties were frowned upon there was no national vote and the candidates did not even participate the political mores of the day forbade it Yet for all that Jeffrey L Pasley contends the election of 1796 was absolutely seminal setting the stage for all of American politics to follow Challenging much of the conventional understanding of this election Pasley argues that Federalist and Democratic Republican were deeply meaningful categories for politicians and citizens of the 1790s even if the names could be inconsistent and the institutional presence lacking He treats the 1796 election as a rough draft of the democratic presidential campaigns that came later rather than as the personal squabble depicted by other historians It set the geographic pattern of New England competing with the South at the two extremes of American politics and it established the basic ideological dynamic of a liberal rights spreading American left arrayed against a conservative society protecting right each with its own competing model of leadership Rather than the inner thoughts and personal lives of the Founders covered in so many other volumes Pasley focuses on images of Adams and Jefferson created by supporters and detractors through the press capturing the way that ordinary citizens in 1796 would have actually experienced candidates they never heard speak Newspaper editors minor officials now forgotten congressman and individual elector candidates all take a leading role in the story to show how politics of the day actually worked Pasley's cogent study rescues the election of 1796 from the shadow of 1800 and invites us to rethink how we view that campaign and the origins of American politics

Child Labor in America Chaim M. Rosenberg, 2013-08-02 At the close of the 19th century more than 2 million American children under age 16 some as young as 4 or 5 were employed on farms in mills canneries factories mines and offices or selling newspapers and fruits and vegetables on the streets The crusaders of the Progressive Era believed child labor was an evil that maimed the children exploited the poor and suppressed adult wages The child should be in school till age 16 they demanded in order to become a good citizen The battle for and against child labor was fought in the press as well as state and federal legislatures Several federal efforts to ban child labor were struck down by the Supreme Court and an attempt to amend the Constitution to ban child labor failed to gain enough support It took the Great Depression and New Deal legislation to pass the Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 and receive the support of the Supreme Court This history of American child labor details the extent to which children worked in various industries the debate over health and social effects and the long battle with agricultural and industrial interests to curtail the practice

The Rise and Fall of the Saturday Globe Ralph Frasca, 1992 In the postbellum nineteenth century journalism reached larger audiences with more information in less time With the rise of industrialization and mechanization the means of conveying news to the public improved dramatically In 1873 Frederic Hudson one of the nation's first journalism historians predicted that these technological advances would spawn genuinely national newspapers Such publications would be circulated to all parts of the country by means of pneumatic tubes he wrote which could convey newspapers from one coast to the other within three hours The prophesy of compressed air blowing bunches of newspapers across the length and breadth of the country was so far awry that it is amusing to consider today However Hudson's forecast of a national newspaper which seemed just as far fetched in that era of a distinctly provincial press came to fruition in only the following decade As the population soared due in large measure to immigration as urban areas blossomed and as the public became increasingly literate more people turned to newspapers for information about their community and nation It was against this backdrop that the Saturday Globe was born in 1881 From its auspicious infancy in Utica New York the Saturday Globe grew into a major newspaper with nationwide circulation Through its pioneering use of regional editions it became the first truly national newspaper in United States history It served as a unifying force for disparate communities which were constantly being redefined by the expansion of industry and the increase in population The Saturday Globe's readership which peaked at nearly 300 000 was attracted by its stunning artwork its national scope and its charming miscellany of stories In many ways the Saturday Globe was a theoretical forerunner of USA Today Although it eschewed the political partisanship so common among newspapers of the era the Saturday Globe emanated a morally conservative tenor which was sometimes difficult to reconcile with the newspaper's tendency toward sensationalism Relying on many diverse sources Ralph Frasca constructs a comprehensive social history of the Saturday Globe placing it in a larger context by showing how cultural technological economic demographic and journalistic forces in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries both created a milieu for the Saturday Globe's inception and success and lead to its demise forty three years later The story of the Saturday Globe offers insight into the processes by which mighty newspapers rise fall and erode into the deepest recesses of time The survival of America's newspapers is just as much a concern now as when the Saturday Globe a mere husk of its former self folded While the Saturday Globe fought a losing battle against imitators and magazines today's newspapers wage a similar war against the encroachment of the broadcast media The history of the Saturday Globe offers a compelling case

Manhood and the American Renaissance David Leverenz, 2019-06-30 In the view of David Leverenz such nineteenth century American male writers as Emerson Hawthorne Melville Thoreau and Whitman were influenced more profoundly by the popular model of the entrepreneurial man of force than they were by their literary precursors and contemporaries Drawing on the insights of feminist theory gender studies psychoanalytical criticism and social history *Manhood and the American Renaissance* demonstrates that gender pressures and class conflicts played as critical a role in literary creation for the male writers of nineteenth century America as they did for the women writers Leverenz interprets male American authors in terms of three major ideologies of manhood linked to the social classes in the Northeast patrician artisan and entrepreneurial He asserts that the older ideologies of patrician gentility and of artisan independence were being challenged from 1820 to 1860 by the new middle class ideology of competitive individualism The male writers of the American Renaissance patrician almost without exception in their backgrounds and self expectations were fascinated yet horrified by the aggressive materialism and the rivalry for dominance they witnessed in the undeferential new men In close readings of the works both of well known male literary figures and of then popular authors such as Richard Henry Dana Jr and Francis Parkman Leverenz discovers a repressed center of manhood beset by fears of humiliation and masochistic fantasies He discerns different patterns in the works of Whitman with his artisan's background and Frederick Douglass who rose from artisan freedom to entrepreneurial power Emphasizing the interplay of class and gender Leverenz also considers how women viewed manhood He concludes that male writers portrayed manhood as a rivalry for dominance but contemporary female writers saw it as patriarchy Two chapters contrast the work of the genteel writers Sarah Hale and Caroline Kirkland with the evangelical works of Susan Warner and Harriet Beecher Stowe A bold and imaginative work *Manhood and the American Renaissance* will enlighten and inspire controversy among all students of American literature nineteenth century American history and the relation of gender and literature America's Public Schools William J.
