Role and purpose of art in literature

Literary periods in both principles:

Literary periods that follow the principle of Art for Art's Sake are:

"'Romanticism" (late 18th to mid 19th century): A movement that emphasized the individual, the subjective, the irrational, the imaginative, the personal, the emotional, and the visionary aspects of art. It rejected the rationalism, classicism, and realism of the previous periods, and celebrated the power of nature, imagination, and creativity. Some of the famous writers of this period were William Wordsworth, Samuel Taylor Coleridge, John Keats, Percy Bysshe Shelley, Lord Byron, and Victor Hugo.

"'Aestheticism" (late 19th century): A movement that advocated for the autonomy and independence of art from moral and social constraints, and celebrated the sensual and decadent aspects of life. It was influenced by the French slogan of "Fart pour Fart" (art for art's sake), and the works of Edgar Allan Poe, Charles Baudelaire, and Walter Pater. Some of the famous writers of this period were Oscar Wilde, Algemon Charles Swinburne, James McNeill Whistler, and Aubrey Beardsley.

"'Modernism" (late 19th to mid 20th century): A movement that experimented with new and innovative forms and styles of art, such as symbolism, impressionism, expressionism, surrealism, and cubism. It challenged the traditional conventions and expectations of art, and explored the traditional conventions and expectations of the famous writers of themses of alienation, fragmentation, and disillusionment in the modern world.
