Cry And Dedication Carlos Bulosan, 1995-05-04 This previously unpublished novel by the author of America Is in the Heart dramatizes the resourcefulness cunning and pain of the Filipino peasants struggle against a heritage of colonization first by Spain and later by the United States Set during the political upheavals of the 1940s and 1950s seven underground rebels old and young male and female intellectual and peasant set off across the Philippine countryside fueled by their outrage over continued U S domination They combat both internal foes from their past memories and experiences and visible enemies who view their clandestine work as a destructive force of communism As they confront danger and face physical and emotional sacrifices along the way their sense of mission conveys a profound vision of democracy and self determination Bulosan s exceptional narrative at once an allegorical and a psychological critique of the West s racism and delusion of supremacy portrays an armed rebellion that can represent many Third World peoples Literary and political Bulosan s work embodies his personal dream of equality and freedom When asked what impelled him to write Bulosan replied To give literate voices to the voiceless to translate the desires and aspirations of the whole Filipino people in the Philippines and abroad in terms relevant to contemporary history Author note Born in 1911 in the Philippines to a peasant family Carlos Bulosan was one of the first wave of Filipino immigrants to come to the United States in the 1930s After several arduous years as a farmworker in California Bulosan became involved with radical intellectuals and started editing the workers magazine The New Tide While hospitalized for three years for tuberculosis and kidney problems Bulosan began writing poetry and short stories Despite having little formal education he saw his talent for writing as a means to give a voice to Filipino struggles both in the Philippines and in the United States He went on to publish three volumes of poetry a best selling collection of stories The Laughter of My Father and America Is in the Heart the much acclaimed chronicle based on his family s battle to overcome poverty violence and racism in the United States The Cry and the Dedication carries on Bulosan s passionate satirical style P E San Juan Jr is Fellow of the Center for the Humanities and Visiting Professor of English Wesleyan University and Director of the Philippines Cultural Studies Center He was recently

chair of the Department of Comparative American Cultures Washington University and Professor of Ethnic Studies at Bowling Green State University Ohio He received the 1999 Centennial Award for Literature from the Philippines Cultural Center His most recent books are Beyond Postcolonial Theory From Exile to Diaspora After Postcolonialism and Racism and Cultural Studies

A Grammar of Tshangla Erik Andvik, 2010-05-20 A Grammar of Tshangla is the first major linguistic description of Tshangla a Tibeto Burman language spoken in Bhutan northeast India and southwest China Written from a functional typological perspective it contains a wealth of illustrative examples both from elicited data and from spontaneously generated texts It is a truly comprehensive description including sections on phonology lexicon morphophonemics morphosyntactic structure clause concatenating constructions as well as discourse pragmatic features The volume will be of interest to language students and to linguists and ethnographic scholars seeking to understand the Bhutanese and South Asian linguistic situation The large amount of raw language data presented here make this Grammar of Tshangla an indispensable tool for students of Tibeto Burman comparative linguistics and morphosyntactic theory in general

Wolff, 2018-10-18 This work divided into two volumes is the study of the history of words in the Austronesian An languages their origin in Proto Austronesian PAn or at later stages and how they developed into the forms that are attested in the current An languages A study of their history entails the reconstruction of the sound system phonology of PAn and an exposition of the sound laws rules whereby the original sounds changed into those attested in the current An languages The primary aim of this work is to examine exhaustively the forms that can be reconstructed for PAn and also for the earliest stage after the An languages began to spread southward from Taiwan For the later stages that is forms that can be traced no further back than to the proto languages of late subgroups we do not attempt to be exhaustive but confine ourselves to only some of the forms that are traceable to those times treating those that figure prominently in the literature on historical An linguistics or those that have special characteristics important for understanding in general how forms arose and the processes that led to change In short the aim of this study is not just to reconstruct protomorphemes and order the reflexes according to the entries they fit under but rather to account for the history of each form that is attested and explain what happened historically to yield the attestations Volume 2 of the Proto Austronesian Phonology is divided into four parts and contains a glossary finder lists from the English translation a bibliography and an index

Ursu,2013-03-09 The second International Conference on Trends in Quantum Electronics TQE 85 was held in Bucharest at the National Centre for Physics in September 1985 and brought together more than 350 scientists from 22 countries In accordance with the objectives established at the first conference which was held in 1982 in conjunction with the third International Summer School in Coherent Optics the second conference concentrated upon the central topics and chief directions of development in quantum electronics which stands out as an area of science and technology that is currently expanding vigorously On the other hand it was also apparent that TQE 85 was primarily influenced by the worldwide celebration in 1985 of the 25th anniversary of the laser a moment of prime importance in the development of many frontline fields including communications chemistry biology health care and materials processing A special session was devoted to this anniversary In keeping with the dynamic spirit of the conference the fine quality of the invited lectures and the other contributions set a high scientific standard for the proceedings Mention should be made of the posters that were presented throughout the conference These together with the exhibition of books and journals and a display of specialized scientific equipment did much to create a framework for effective communication and stimulating interaction to the benefit of all the participants Of invaluable help in the preparation of the conference was the collaboration of the International Scientific Advisory Committee

Unsettling Exiles Angelina Chin, 2023-04-25. The conventional story of Hong Kong celebrates the people who fled the mainland in the wake of the establishment of the People's Republic of China in 1949. In this telling, migrants thrived under British colonial rule, transforming Hong Kong into a cosmopolitan city and an industrial and financial hub. *Unsettling Exiles* recasts identity formation in Hong Kong, demonstrating that the complexities of crossing borders shaped the city's uneasy place in the Sinophone world. Angelina Y. Chin foregrounds the experiences of the many people who passed through Hong Kong without settling down or finding a sense of belonging, including refugees, deportees, undesirable residents, and members of sea communities. She emphasizes that flows of people did not stop at Hong Kong's borders but also bled into neighboring territories such as Taiwan and Macau. Chin develops the concept of the Southern Periphery, the region along the southern frontier of the PRC outside its administrative control yet closely tied to its political space. Both the PRC and governments in the Southern Periphery implemented strict migration and deportation policies in pursuit of border control, with profound consequences for people in transit. Chin argues that Hong Kong identity emerged from the collective trauma of exile and dislocation, as well as a sense of being on the margins of both the Communist and Nationalist Chinese regimes during the Cold War. Drawing on wide-ranging research, *Unsettling Exiles* sheds new light on Hong Kong's ambivalent relationship to the mainland, its role in the global Cold War, and the origins of today's political currents.
