SEMIOTICS

Semiotics is the study of signs. It is both the theory & analysis of signs & signifying practices.



Ferdinand de Saussure
(1857-1913)

Saussure was a french linguist that was one of the first to produce a semiotic theory during work in the early 1900's. Saussure stated that a sign is made up of two parts, the SIGNIFIER and the SIGNIFIED.



Charles Sanders Peirce
(1839-1914)

Charles Sandes Peirce, was an American philosopher that also formulated a semiotic theory around the same time as Saussure, the early 1900's. Peirce stated semiotics to be the relationship between a SYMBOL, ICON and an INDEX.

SIGN

A successful, understandable form of communication.

SIGNIFIER

Any motion, gesture, image, sound, pattern, or event that conveys meaning and communicates.



Rose

SIGNIFIED

The concept that a signifier refers to, the meaning it conveys.



CONNOTATION

The feelings, ideas and cultural meanings which are associated with the word or object. Not the literal meaning.



DENOTATION

The literal or primary meaning of a word, in contrast to the feelings or ideas that the word suggests.

ICONS

Signs where the signifier resembles the signified.



SYMBOLS

Signs where the relation between signifier and signified is purely conventional and culturally specific.



INDEXES

Signs where the signifier is caused by the signified.



Syntagm

A single word or element of design that, when altered, can change the overall meaning.

Paradigm

A group or related ideas that are interchangeable in a sentence or design, yet they still have the same collective meaning.
