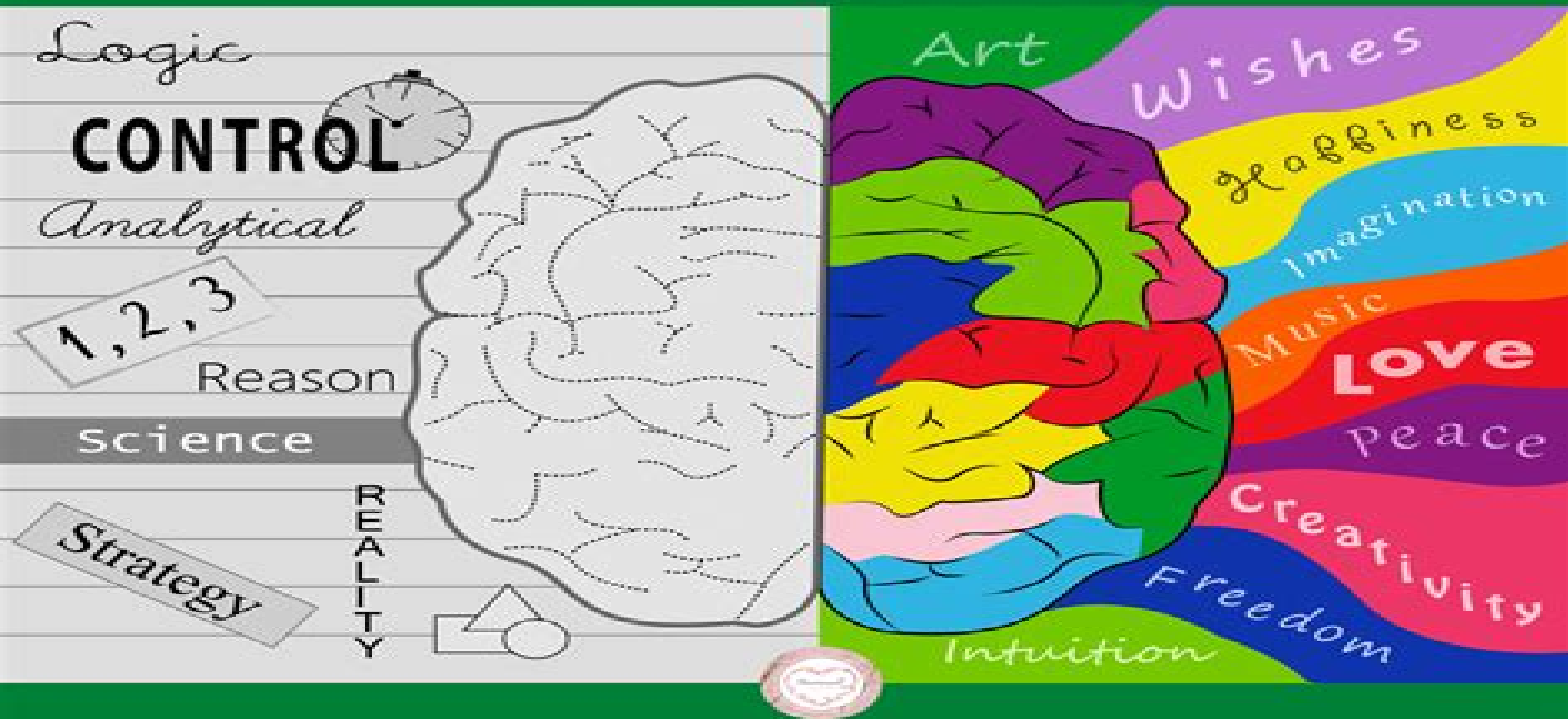
There are two kinds of thinking that utilize two different parts of the brain:
