philosophy The starting point of its main argument is a remark from Diktat f r Schlick c 1932 33 in which Wittgenstein proposes an analogy between ornaments and nonsensical sentences The attempt to extract from it an account of the relation between the Kundmanngasse and the Tractatus Logico Philosophicus 1921 leads to the writings of Adolf Loos whose influence Wittgenstein recognized The discussion of Loos s writings suggests that the analogy should be understood not as one between actual ornaments and nonsensical sentences but as one between Loos s and Wittgenstein s uses of these notions So understood it favors the so called resolute reading of the Tractatus and reveals that both Wittgenstein's use of nonsense and Loos s use of ornaments are means to the end of promoting self understanding The book concludes that both the Kundmanngasse and the Tractatus are results of Wittgenstein's efforts at this kind of self understanding These can be construed as ways of acknowledging our humanity which in turn can be seen as a unifying element of Wittgenstein s philosophy The Passive Eye Branka Arsi?, 2003 The Passive Eye is a revolutionary and historically rich account of Berkeley's theory of vision In this formidable work the author considers the theory of the embodied subject and its passions in light of a highly dynamic conception of infinity Arsic shows the profound affinities between Berkeley and Spinoza and offers a highly textual reading of Berkeley on the concept of an exhausted subjectivity.
