MacLeish, 2015-03-01 An intimate look at war through the lives of soldiers and their families at Fort Hood Making War at Fort Hood offers an illuminating look at war through the daily lives of the people whose job it is to produce it Kenneth MacLeish conducted a year of intensive fieldwork among soldiers and their families at and around the US Army s Fort Hood in central Texas He shows how war s reach extends far beyond the battlefield into military communities where violence is as routine boring and normal as it is shocking and traumatic Fort Hood is one of the largest military installations in the world and many of the 55 000 personnel based there have served multiple tours in Iraq and Afghanistan MacLeish provides intimate portraits of Fort Hood s soldiers and those closest to them drawing on numerous in depth interviews and diverse ethnographic material He explores the exceptional position that soldiers occupy in relation to violence not only trained to fight and kill but placed deliberately in harm s way and offered up to die The death and destruction of war happen to soldiers on purpose MacLeish interweaves gripping narrative with critical theory and anthropological analysis to vividly describe this unique condition of vulnerability Along the way he sheds new light on the dynamics of military family life stereotypes of veterans what it means for civilians to say thank you to soldiers and other questions about the sometimes ordinary sometimes agonizing labor of making war Making War at Fort Hood is the first ethnography to examine the everyday lives of the soldiers families and communities who personally bear the burden of America s most recent wars

Army of Hope, Army of Alienation John P. Hawkins, 2001-05-30 This ethnography describes the intense contradictions that exist between the cultural values of American life and the cultural values needed to

survive in combat as represented through the experiences of forward deployed U S Army units in Germany during the height of the Cold War Living in constant military readiness yet participating in peacetime community and family processes Army personnel had to tolerate the contradictions and live by both sets of principles In soldier perception family life and community activities ought to have been guided by American rather than military values Yet the military ran the community and military activities penetrated and disrupted family life In Germany the penetration and disruption was much exacerbated by isolation for these Americans did not generally have the language or cultural skills to escape from the military community Rather they were marooned in an intensely judgmental fish bowl community where there was no private life The resulting scrutiny and the measures people took to avoid it and sustain autonomy corrupted the community its families and the units themselves The scrutiny with its attendant risks and the intense contradiction in values led to feelings of profound alienation

Perpetrators within provides the first ethnographic account of the experiences of military families of the Argentine dictatorship 1976-83 At the crossover of multiple disciplines this groundbreaking study brings advancements in the fields of military and conflict studies Latin American history transitional justice and ethnographic methods The military juntas that seized power in Argentina in 1976 waged a brutal dirty war against communism leading to seven years of authoritarian rule that claimed thousands of lives The regime suppressed political opposition through kidnapping torture and clandestine executions Although efforts to bring the military to justice began in 1985 legal obstacles delayed prosecutions for over 20 years It wasn't until 2005 that trials resumed resulting in the conviction of hundreds of former officers for crimes committed during the dictatorship Perpetrators within questions these unique subjects directly For the first time the military of the dictatorship are approached as a community of families and comrades which includes spouses children and brothers in arms better to understand the personal and collective experiences of those linked to the regime's violent past Based on extensive research with former junior officers many now imprisoned their wives and adult children the book unveils the social and family life of the military of the 1970s it investigates the everyday unexceptional scenarios of repression and it describes the long road to justice from the point of view of military families involved in the trials A vital contribution to understanding the workings of kinship military power and violence this book offers a deeper and original perspective on one of the darkest chapters in Latin American history

Parameters , 2001 **Beyond Post-Traumatic Stress** Jean Scandlyn, 2017-07-05 When soldiers at Fort Carson were charged with a series of 14 murders PTSD and other invisible wounds of war were thrown into the national spotlight With these events as their starting point Jean Scandlyn and Sarah Hautzinger argue for a new approach to combat stress and trauma seeing them not just as individual medical pathologies but as fundamentally collective cultural phenomena Their deep ethnographic research including unusual access to affected soldiers at Fort Carson also engaged an extended labyrinth of friends family communities military culture social services bureaucracies the media and many other layers of society Through this profound and moving book they insist that invisible combat injuries are a social challenge demanding collective reconciliation with the post 9 11 wars

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
