Anecdotal evidence suggests that Chinese immigrants tend to be fearful of death and avoid discussions on the subject that they are culturally inclined to be unassertive and do not wish to speak out about their own care and that they are reticent when asked about personal information because their culture is family oriented and stresses conformity rather than self expression. While these attitudes and behaviors are reported by clinicians there has been no systematic investigative documentation. Carefully interviewed participants. The study participants included 60 each of Chinese born and Euro American frail homebound elderly men and women. Chinese speakers were interviewed in their native language. Participants responses to inventories exploring life events, control beliefs, values and attitudes toward death were analyzed to determine whether Chinese born elderly have attitudes and beliefs that require different treatment approaches. Upset common stereotype. While the study shows significant differences in attitudes it also indicates many similarities between the two groups. One of the most significant findings which has the greatest implication for further investigation was that contrary to the stereotypes Chinese born elderly do freely discuss all aspects of their lives including views on death and dying and express wishes to be concerned in their own health care decisions.

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
