Alberta Formed - Alberta Transformed Alberta 2005 Centennial History Society, 2006-04-18 *Alberta Formed Alberta Transformed* is a two volume set spanning a remarkable 12 000 years of history and showcasing the work of 34 of Alberta's most respected scholars Volume 1 sets the stage from human beginnings in Alberta to the eve of Alberta's inauguration as a province in 1905 while Volume 2 takes readers through the twentieth century and up to the 2005 centennial Eric J. Hanson's Financial History of Alberta, 1905-1950 Eric John Hanson, 2003 Eric Hanson Alberta's first and arguably greatest economist wrote a number of influential books on federal provincial relations education finance health care finance and energy economics His doctoral thesis was entitled *A Financial History of Alberta 1905-1950* and was found by Paul Boothe at the University of Alberta library while Boothe was doing research on Alberta government spending almost forty five years after it was written This forgotten gem sheds light on the institutional economic and public development of the province from a financial perspective With a detailed and analytical introduction this edited work provides historical perspective on the perennial problems facing Alberta's fiscal managers wildly fluctuating revenues in migration seemingly insatiable demands for infrastructure high quality public services and resistance to taxes while exuding an optimistic attitude for the future

Forging Alberta's Constitutional Framework Richard Connors, John M. Law, University of Alberta. Centre for Constitutional Studies, 2005-11 *Forging Alberta's Constitutional Framework* analyzes the principal events and processes that

precipitated the emergence and formation of the law and legal culture of Alberta from the foundation of the Hudson's Bay in 1670 until the eve of the centenary of the Province in 2005. The formation of Alberta's constitution and legal institutions was by no means a simple process by which English and Canadian law was imposed upon a receptive and passive population. Challenges to authority, latent lawlessness, interaction between indigenous and settler societies, periods pre and post 1905 of jurisdictional confusion and demands for individual group and provincial rights and recognitions are as much part of Alberta's legal history as the heroic and mythic images of an emergent and orderly Canadian west patrolled from the outset by red-coated mounted police and peopled by peaceful and law-abiding subjects of the Crown. Papers focus on the development of criminal law in the Canadian west in the nineteenth century, the Natural Resources Transfer Agreement of 1930, the National Energy Program of the 1980s, Federal-Provincial relations and the role and responsibilities of the offices of Justices of the Peace and of the Lieutenant Governor and the legacies of the Lougheed and Klein governments. *Alberta Premiers of the Twentieth Century* University of Regina, Canadian Plains Research Center, 2004. From the optimism associated with provincial status in 1905 through the trials of Depression and war, the boom times of the post-war period and the economic vagaries of the 1980s and the 1990s, the twentieth century was a time of growth and hardship, development and change for Alberta and its people. And during the century, twelve men from a variety of political parties and from very different backgrounds led the government of this province. The names of some like William Aberhart, Ernest Manning and Peter Lougheed are still household names, while others like Arthur Sifton, Herbert Greenfield and Richard Reid have been all but forgotten. Yet each in his unique way, for better or for worse, helped to mould and steer the destiny of the province he governed. These are their stories. No Ordinary Woman Janice Sanford Beck, 2001. Mary, born into a wealthy Quaker family in Pennsylvania, was a precocious child who excelled at school. She was much more interested in the arts and traveling. A trip across Canada in 1889 proved the turning point in Mary's life. Not only did she meet her future husband, doctor and botanist Charles Schaffer, she also fell hopelessly in love with the mountains. After Charles' death, Mary embarked on explorations into the Canadian Rockies at a time when it was not thought proper for a woman to do so. Her most famous trips of 1907 and 1908 resulted in the rediscovery of Maligne Lake and the highly regarded book *Old Indian Trails of the Canadian Rockies*. Mary eventually settled in Banff and there married her handsome young guide Billy Warren. Since her death in 1937, she continues to inspire young people and women in particular.
