The old man was asked:

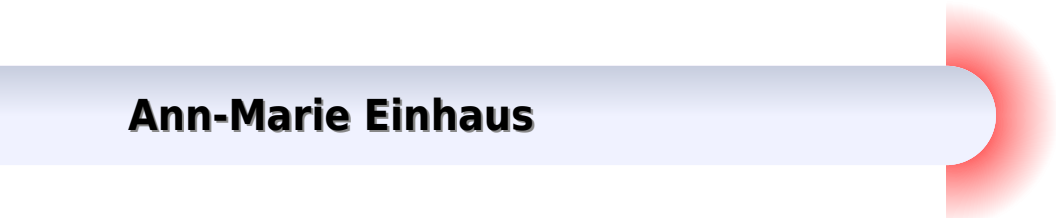
Villager: what happened to you?
