Angels of Art: Women and Art in American Society, 1876-1914 , Why Art Cannot Be Taught James Elkins, 2001-05-17 He also addresses the phenomenon of art critiques as a microcosm for teaching art as a whole and dissects real life critiques highlighting presuppositions and dynamics that make them confusing and suggesting ways to make them more helpful Elkins's no nonsense approach clears away the assumptions about art instruction that are not borne out by classroom practice For example he notes that despite much talk about instilling visual acuity and teaching technique in practice neither teachers nor students behave as if those were their principal goals He addresses the absurdity of pretending that sexual issues are absent from life drawing classes and questions the practice of holding up great masters and masterpieces as models for students capable of producing only mediocre art He also discusses types of art including art that takes time to complete and art that isn't serious that cannot be learned in studio art classes *Angels of Art* Bailey Van Hook, 2004-06-11 Images of women were ubiquitous in America at the turn of the last century In painting and sculpture they took on a bewildering variety of identities from Venus Ariadne and Diana to Law Justice the Arts and Commerce Bailey Van Hook argues here that the artists' concepts of art coincided with the construction of gender in American culture She finds that certain characteristics such as ideal beautiful decorative and pure both describe this art and define the perceived role of women in American society at the time Most late nineteenth century American artists had trained in Paris where they learned to use female imagery as a pictorial language of provocative sensuality Van Hook first places the American artists in an international context by discussing the works of their French teachers including Jean-Léon Gérôme and Alexandre Cabanel She goes on to explore why they soon had to distance themselves from that context primarily because their art was perceived as either openly sensual or too obliquely foreign by American audiences Van Hook delineates the modes of representation the American painters chose which ranged from the more traditional allegorical or mythological subjects to a decorative figure painting indebted to Whistler Changing American culture ultimately rejected these idealized female images as too genteel and eventually too academic and European *Angels of Art* is the first study to discuss the predominance of images of women across stylistic boundaries and within the wider context of European art It relies heavily on contemporary sources both to document critical responses and to find intersecting patterns in attitudes toward women and art **Thomas Hovenden** Anne Gregory Terhune, Patricia Smith Scanlan, 2006-09-06 A realistic genre painter and recorder of everyday activities such as those involving home and family Hovenden had a particular gift for choosing subjects with wide recognition and appeal His work reflects a Victorian ethos unlike many artists of the time however Hovenden's work featured African American subjects in domestic settings His firm belief in sentiment and beauty as the goals of artistic pursuits is evident in the nostalgic paintings for which he is best known such as *The Last Moments of John Brown* in which Brown is depicted stopping on his way to the gallows to kiss a young black child *The Académie Royale de Peinture et de Sculpture* Christian

Representing Belief Michael Paul Driskel, 2010-11-01 Representing Belief provides a detailed discussion and analysis of the forms and meanings in religious art of nineteenth century France This genre usually assigned minimal importance by writers on the period turns out to occupy a central place in the cultural history of the era touching the core of the century's conflict between tradition and modernity science and faith ultramontanism and naturalism Although it was generally assumed that this kind of art was of little importance in the evolution of modern painting Driskel demonstrates that in reality it played a crucial role Many of the artists discussed are firmly installed in the present canon Delacroix Ingres Manet

Gauguin while others Flandrin Orsel Gleyre Cazin were major figures in their own time though largely forgotten today Writing from an interdisciplinary perspective and employing concepts derived from structuralist and poststructuralist theory Driskel moves beyond simple formalism to restore a category of once important works to a meaningful context thereby offering others a model by which to discuss and interpret these paintings Carefully charting the genealogies of hieraticism and naturalism he demonstrates that a dramatic shift occurred in the 1860s and 1870s as naturalism gained acceptance among ultramontanes and the hieratic mode began to attract the interest of adherents to the belief system of modernism Representing Belief is the first book to situate this art in its social and historical contexts and to approach it from this point of view

Victorian Artists' Autograph Replicas Julie F. Codell, 2020-05-10 This book is a wide ranging exploration of the production of Victorian art autograph replicas a painting's subsequent versions created by the same artist who painted the first version Autograph replicas were considered originals not copies and were highly valued by collectors in Britain America Japan Australia and South Africa Motivated by complex combinations of aesthetic and commercial interests replicas generated a global and especially transatlantic market between the 1870s and the 1940s and almost all collected replicas were eventually donated to US public museums giving replicas authority in matters of public taste and museums modern cultural roles This book will be of interest to scholars in art history museum studies and economic history

Degas Theodore Reff, 1976 More than any other artist in the Impressionist group Degas was fascinated by ideas and consciously based his work on them What I do is the result of reflection and study of the great masters he once confessed of inspiration spontaneity temperament I know nothing Yet his work has been understood very inadequately from that point of view Publications on him once dominated by memoirs inspired by his remarkable personality are now concerned with cataloguing and studying limited aspects of his complex art Its intellectual power and originality which were evident to contemporary writers like Duranty and Valery have not been studied sufficiently by more recent critics It is this side of Degas's art as seen in his ingenious pictorial strategies and technical innovations his use of motifs like the window the mirror and the picture within the picture his invention of striking psychologically compelling compositions and his creation of a sculptural idiom at once formal and vernacular that is the subject of these essays Inevitably given the range of his intellectual interests the essays are also concerned with his contacts with leading novelists and poets of his time and his efforts to illustrate or draw inspiration from their works Throughout the author makes use of an important largely unpublished source the material in Degas's notebooks on which he has recently published a complete catalogue Publisher's description
