single source The impact of their introduction upon the young people that use them is thus far under researched This study begins to fill this gap by outlining the support approach of the German youth career agencies that centers on gaining a more complete picture of the young person s life situation in order to offer them a range of possible support programs The study interrogates whether the youth career agencies do offer more personalized advice for young people during their transition to employment than classical job center teams It argues that if the cooperative relationships between the actors involved in the youth career agencies are of good quality more personalized support is likely to be offered there However personalized support in youth career agencies is still limited by the diverse specifications and target figures demanded of job centers by the Federal Employment Agency and also influenced by the professional background of the individual caseworkers
