In each case the discussion is rooted in a larger consideration of the rule or misrule of law. The second half of the book turns from the rule of law to the issue of property specifically the Lockean version of the self that tied identity to legal conceptions of property and economic value. In separate discussions of Charles Chesnutt Edith Wharton and Theodore Dreiser Reconstituting Authority reveals authors as closely engaged with those changing perspectives on property and identity in ways that challenged the racial gendered and economic consequences of America's possessive individualism.
