There was only one place on that list that cared for women, that place was Christy Place. I will never forget that day while I am alive. It was Saturday and unfortunately all the organizations were closed on the weekend. I called every phone number on this list and left a message on every voice message I asked to receive a call. I was very, very scared. You see, I made the terrible mistake of searching for HIV on Google, and the first thing that came up was a picture. He was lying on a hospital bed and his body was nothing more than a skeleton. He was taking his last breath and I have never been so scared in my life.
