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Agriculture and Slavery in Missouri's Little Dixie R. Douglas Hurt, 1992 Although Missouri has strong cultural ties to the Upper South and major economic links to the Deep South most historians have focused their agricultural studies on states other than Missouri In Agriculture and Slavery in Missouri's Little Dixie Douglas Hurt provides the first systematic study of agriculture and rural life in one of the most vital sections of Missouri prior to the Civil War This seven county area along the Missouri River known as Little Dixie was the most important hemp tobacco and live stock producing region of the state as well as a major slaveholding area The people who settled Little Dixie had emigrated primarily from Kentucky Virginia and Tennessee They brought southern culture with them and adapted it to their new environment economically socially and politically Although the settlers began as subsistence farmers unlimited opportunities and access by river to New Orleans and St Louis made commercial farming possible almost immediately Hurt provides the reader with a broad discussion of land acquisition settlement and town development in the region He surveys the major agricultural endeavors of the southerners who settled there considering technological change agricultural organization breed improvement and transportation Hurt also traces the development of rural life emphasizing the importance of religion education and mercantile activities Slavery permeated all aspects of society in Little Dixie Hurt discusses the acquisition and sale of slaves their management and the political protection of slavery and he relates the significance of slavery in Little Dixie to the Deep South One of his most important findings concerns the extensive trade of slave children in Little Dixie Farmers and planters driven by the struggle for profit supported both slavery and the Union Consequently political division in the state mirrored the national debate over slavery but also showed the uniqueness of Missouri both geographically and culturally This book will prove useful for anyone interested in American agricultural history the economic and social history of the Upper South and Missouri Agriculture and Slavery in Missouri's Little Dixie provides a much needed overview of the region's past

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On Slavery's Border Diane Mutti Burke, 2010-12 On Slavery s Border is a bottom up examination of how slavery and slaveholding were influenced by both the geography and the scale of the slaveholding enterprise Missouri s strategic access to important waterways made it a key site at the periphery of the Atlantic world By the time of statehood in 1821 people were moving there in large numbers especially from the upper South hoping to replicate the slave society they d left behind Diane Mutti Burke focuses on the Missouri counties located along the Mississippi and Missouri rivers to investigate small scale slavery at the level of the household and neighborhood She examines such topics as small slaveholders child rearing and fiscal strategies the economics of slavery relations between slaves and owners the challenges faced by slave families sociability among enslaved and free Missourians within rural neighborhoods and the disintegration of slavery during the Civil War Mutti Burke argues that economic and social factors gave Missouri slavery an especially intimate quality Owners directly oversaw their slaves and lived in close proximity with them sometimes in the same building White Missourians believed this made for a milder version of bondage Some slaves who expressed fear of being sold further south seemed to agree Mutti Burke reveals however that while small slaveholding created some advantages for slaves it also made them more vulnerable to abuse and interference in their personal lives In a region with easy access to the free states the perception that slavery was threatened spawned white anxiety which frequently led to violent reassertions of supremacy

The Roots of Rough Justice Michael J. Richards, 2015-04-06 Who freed America s slaves The real story of the Thirteenth Amendment to the Constitution which codified the rhetoric of the Emancipation Proclamation remains surprisingly obscure in the public imagination Too often this story has been told as a mere coda to that of the Proclamation or as a tale of the Great Mr Lincoln Neither is historically accurate or complete In Leonard Richards s hands the full story makes for the best kind of

political narrative gripping and suspenseful The prime mover of the amendment was James Ashley firebrand congressman from Toledo Ohio An angry and articulate idealist Ashley pushed Congress the president and the country again and again until the arc of justice bent his way Both a tale of righteous rage and legislative legerdemain Outlawing Slavery details Ashley s campaign replete with horse trading arm twisting and maybe vote buying With many Congressmen and for a long time Abraham Lincoln resisting Ashley s demand for a constitutional amendment Ashley had to engage in procedural shenanigans during a lame duck session in 1864-1865 to maneuver Congress into finally doing the right thing

Slavery on the Periphery Kristen Epps, 2016-12 *Slavery on the Periphery* traces the rise and fall of chattel slavery on the Kansas Missouri border from the earliest years of American settlement through the Civil War exploring how its presence shaped life on this critical geographical political and social fault line Kristen Epps explores how this dynamic small scale system characterized by slaves diverse occupations close contact between slaves and slaveholders a robust hiring market and abroad marriages emerged from an established upper South slaveholding culture Awareness of space and local landscapes was also a defining feature of slaves experiences because slave mobility could be a powerful means of resistance This mobility became particularly crucial when the sectional conflict escalated in the 1850s and 1860s as both enslaved and white residents became central players in a violent national struggle over the future of slavery in America Drawing on extensive archival research Epps makes clear that slavery s expansion into Kansas was more than a theoretical ideological debate Chattel slavery was already extending its grasp into the West By foregrounding African Americans place in the border narrative Epps illustrates how slavery s presence on this geographic periphery set the stage for the Civil War and emancipation here as it did elsewhere in the United States

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
