precisely why the Axis allies were so dysfunctional as a collective force sometimes for seemingly mundane but vital reasons a shortage of interpreters for example His analysis covers coalition warfare at every level demonstrating that some military services were better at working with their allies than others while also pointing to rare successes such as Rommel's effective coordination with Italian forces in North Africa In the end while some individual Axis units fought with distinction if not on a par with the vaunted Wehrmacht and helped Germany achieve some of its military aims the coalition's overall military performance was riddled with disappointments Breaking new ground DiNardo's work enlarges our understanding of Germany's defeat while at the same time offering a timely reminder of the challenges presented by coalition warfare

Marching Through Chaos John A.
