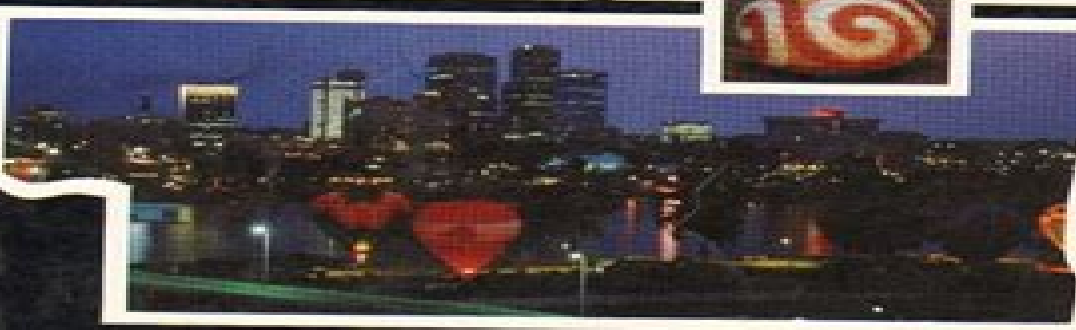

Blair, Jay Barth, 2005-01-01 Published a decade and a half after the late Diane D Blair s influential book Arkansas Politics and Government this freshly revised edition builds on her work which highlighted both the decades of failure by Arkansas s government to live up to the state s motto of Regnat Populus The People Rule and the positive trends of democracy Since the first edition Arkansas has seen the two term U S presidency of a native son the retirement of players who defined the state s politics in the modern era the further realignment of the state s electorate the passage of the nation s most extreme legislative term limits the complete overhaul of the state s court system and the declaration that the state s public education system was unconstitutionally inadequate and inequitable While maintaining the basic structure of Blair s original work with its focus on important historical patterns and the ways in which the past continues to shape the present the second edition details the causes and consequences of recent changes in Arkansas and asks whether they are profound and permanent or merely transitory variations in symbol and style Jay Barth argues that although Arkansas currently expresses a healthier representative democracy than throughout most of its history its political and governmental entities are still sharply limited as effective instruments of the people

Barnes, 2016-11-01 Winner 2017 Ragsdale Award A timely study that puts current issues religious intolerance immigration the separation of church and state race relations and politics in historical context The masthead of the Liberator an anti Catholic newspaper published in Magnolia Arkansas displayed from 1912 to 1915 an image of the Whore of Babylon She was an immoral woman sitting on a seven headed beast holding a golden cup full of her abominations and intended to represent the Catholic Church Propaganda of this type was common during a nationwide surge in antipathy to Catholicism in the early twentieth century This hostility was especially intense in largely Protestant Arkansas where for example a 1915 law required the inspection of convents to ensure that priests could not keep nuns as sexual slaves Later in the decade anti Catholic prejudice attached itself to the campaign

against liquor and when the United States went to war in 1917 suspicion arose against German speakers most of whom in Arkansas were Roman Catholics In the 1920s the Ku Klux Klan portrayed Catholics as inauthentic Americans and claimed that the Roman church was trying to take over the country's public schools institutions and the government itself In 1928 a Methodist senator from Arkansas Joe T Robinson was chosen as the running mate to balance the ticket in the presidential campaign of Al Smith a Catholic which brought further attention Although public expressions of anti Catholicism eventually lessened prejudice was once again visible with the 1960 presidential campaign won by John F Kennedy Anti Catholicism in Arkansas illustrates how the dominant Protestant majority portrayed Catholics as a feared or despised other a phenomenon that was particularly strong in Arkansas

United States District Courts and Judges of Arkansas, 1836-1960 Frances Mitchell Ross, 2016-05-02 The book begins with statehood and continues with Congress's decision to expand jurisdiction of the original 1836 District Court of Arkansas to include the vast Indian Territory to the west The territory's formidable size and rampant lawlessness brought in an overwhelming number of cases The situation was only somewhat mitigated in 1851 when Congress split the state into eastern and western districts which were still served by just one judge who travelled between the two courts A new judgeship for the Western District was created in 1871 and new seats for that court were established but it wasn't until 1896 that Congress finally ended all jurisdiction of Arkansas's Western District Court over the Indian Territory

1934-1968 was a writer who did not live to see most of his fiction and poetry in print. A son of Sweet Home, Arkansas, and Harlem, he devoted himself to the creation of a black literary cosmos, one in which black literature and culture were windows into the human condition. While he certainly should be understood in the context of the cultural and political movements of the 1960s—Black Arts, Black Power, and Civil Rights—his writing and ultimately his life were filled with ambiguities and contradictions. Dumas was shot and killed in 1968 in Harlem, months before his thirty-fourth birthday, by a white transit policeman under circumstances never fully explained. After his death, he became a kind of literary legend, but one whose full story was unknown. A devoted cadre of friends and later admirers from the 1970s to the present pushed for the publication of his work. Toni Morrison championed him as an absolute genius. Amiri Baraka, a writer not quick to praise others, claimed that Dumas produced actual art, real man, and stunning. Eugene Redmond and Quincy Troupe heralded Dumas's poetry, short stories, and work as an editor of little magazines. With *Visible Man*, Jeffrey B. Leak offers a full examination of both Dumas's life and his creative development. Our Own Sweet Sounds Robert Cochran,1995-03-01 A rich portrait of the community that is Arkansas manifested in song *Our Own Sweet Sounds* celebrates the diversity of musical forms and music makers that have graced the state since territorial times Beginning with the earliest references to Quapaw and Caddo music as first reported by seventeenth century European explorers and continuing forward to the bizarrely named grunge bands who will be stars tomorrow Robert Cochran traces the music and voices that have enriched the life of the Natural State Arkansas many are starting to realize was caught in a cultural crossfire of music There were the nearby western swing influence of Tulsa the blues of Memphis the Louisiana Hayride of Shreveport and the influence of Ozark music from Missouri All of this resulted in the Arkansas cross culture of blues country folk and rock music creating a broad spectrum of musical styles and musicians that has left an indelible impression on the Arkansas cultural scene This new edition includes approximately seventy new artists some of whom became famous after 1996 when the first edition was published such as Joe Nichols and some of whom were left out of the original edition such as Little Willie John The valuable Featured Performers section lengthy discussions of individual artists with their photographs is now one third larger This new edition heavily illustrated is a loving tribute to the common music that has filled local airwaves lifted community gatherings to the level of joyous festivities and enlivened the spirit of music lovers everywhere

Hillbilly Hellraisers J. Blake Perkins,2017-09-11 Long a bastion of antigovernment feeling the Ozark region today is home to fervent strains of conservative influenced sentiment Does rural heritage play an exceptional role in

the perpetuation of these attitudes Have such outlooks been continuous J Blake Perkins searches for the roots of rural defiance in the Ozarks and discovers how it changed over time Eschewing generalities Perkins focuses on the experiences and attitudes of rural people themselves as they interacted with government from the late nineteenth century through the twentieth century He uncovers the reasons local disputes and uneven access to government power fostered markedly different reactions by hill people as time went by Resistance in the earlier period sprang from upland small farmers conflicts with capitalist elites who held the local levers of federal power But as industry and agribusiness displaced family farms after World War II a conservative cohort of town business elites local political officials and midwestern immigrants arose from the region s new low wage union averse economy As Perkins argues this modern antigovernment conservatism bore little resemblance to the backcountry populism of an earlier age but had much in common with the movement elsewhere
