Jehl, 2004 Because of its diverse birdlife and polar bears the Churchill Manitoba region is a world famous destination for natural history studies and ecotourism Detailed ornithological studies have been conducted there for more than a century and the earliest records date to 1619 There is probably no other area in the subarctic with such an extensive record In addition Churchill has the longest continuous record of meteorological conditions for any high latitude locality *Birds of the Churchill Region* is a popular yet scholarly book that provides current information on the avifauna of Churchill and adjacent regions of northern Manitoba It also synthesizes the detailed record from the 20th century along with the extensive historical record to provide a basis for studying long term faunal change presents information on the natural history of selected species and highlights the historical contributions to Canadian natural history by one of its greatest explorers Samuel Hearne who used Churchill as a base in the mid 18th century It is intended to be informative to a broad range of interests including tourists local residents professional biologists and climatologists *Birds of Ontario: Habitat Requirements, Limiting Factors, and Status* Al Sandilands, 2011-01-01 The volumes in the *Birds of Ontario* series summarize life history requirements of bird species that are normally part of the ecology of Ontario This is the second volume in the series and completes the treatment of the nonpasserine bird species occurring in Ontario on a regular basis Information on habitat limiting factors and status is summarized for 83 species in this volume These topics are covered for the three primary avian seasons breeding migration and winter Habitat nest sites territoriality site fidelity annual reproductive effort habitat loss and degradation environmental contaminants and a variety of other topics are covered in the species accounts Maps depicting breeding and wintering range are presented for most species along with drawings by Ross James *Birds of Ontario* is an essential reference source for wildlife biologists environmental consultants and planners preparing or reviewing environmental impact statements and environmental assessments Serious birders will find the volumes of interest as well Although the books focus on Ontario birds the information is highly relevant to adjacent provinces and states *Birds of Nunavut* James M. Winn, 2013-11-21 The majority of the chapters in this volume are structured to include a balance between literature review original data and synthesis The research approaches taken by the authors are generally of two kinds One centers on the long term in depth study of a single species in which many aspects of its natural history are examined in detail The other is a comparative one which involves investigating particular questions by examining species or by comparing groups of species that may include taxonomic and/or ecological affinities Most of the chapters concern obvious aspects of breeding behavior including habitat selection the effects of age on breeding communication mating systems synchrony of breeding activities development of behavior pre fledging parental care and post fledging parental care Of these topics many relate directly to the advantages and disadvantages of coloniality a conspicuous behavior pattern in marine birds As such they provide a picture for the further study of coloniality and the social behavior of many other animals Other important areas of marine bird breeding behavior such as courtship behavior antipredator behavior information transfer have not been included because of space limitations Since man s encroachment on the seashore and continental shelf poses certain threats to marine birds a volume elucidating various aspects of their biology has multiple uses As well as being of value to ornithologists the volume should be useful to managers involved with coastal planning **Song of the North Wind** Paul A. Johnsgard, 1979-01-01 For centuries the snow goose has signified the passing seasons to the Indians its white feathers a symbol of the breadth of life and a reminder of the roles the birds played as messengers between heaven and earth The importance of the geese in these roles is attested by their prominence in Indian lore and myth As a boy growing up in North Dakota Paul A Johnsgard measured his winters not by conventional time units but in the days it took for the snow geese to return from their wintering grounds to Lake Traverse In this book he recounts the story of one year in the life of a pair of snow geese the incubation and breeding of the young in the Arctic their hazardous migration to winter quarters near the Gulf of Mexico and the spring migration back to the Arctic **Canadian Books in Print** , 1982 Birds of the Yukon Territory Pamela H. Hughes, 2011-11-01 The Yukon is a land of remarkable wilderness diverse ecosystems and profound beauty It is also home to a unique assemblage of birds As of 2002 288 bird species have been documented in the Yukon with 223 occurring regularly They occupy an amazing range of habitats from the most barren mountain peaks to lush valley bottom forests and are an integral part of the cultural heritage of Yukon First Nations people The vast areas of natural habitat with limited road access can make the study of birds challenging but are key in defining the nature of birding in the Yukon Birds of the Yukon Territory is the result of a decade long project initiated to gather and share what is known about the Yukon s birdlife Lavishly illustrated with 600 colour photographs and 223 hand drawn bird illustrations the book presents a wealth of information on bird distribution migration and breeding chronology nesting behaviour and habitat use and on conservation concerns Two hundred and eighty eight species of birds are documented including 223 regular species and 65 casual and accidental species In compiling this meticulously researched volume the authors consulted over 166 000 records in a database created by the Canadian Wildlife Service with information dating back to 1861 Sections on birds in Aboriginal culture and history and bird names in the Yukon First Nations and Inuvialuit languages enhance the book as do the numerous easily interpreted charts and graphs Destined to become a basic reference work on the avifauna of the North Birds of the Yukon Territory is a must have for bird enthusiasts and anyone interested in the natural history of the Yukon and the North
