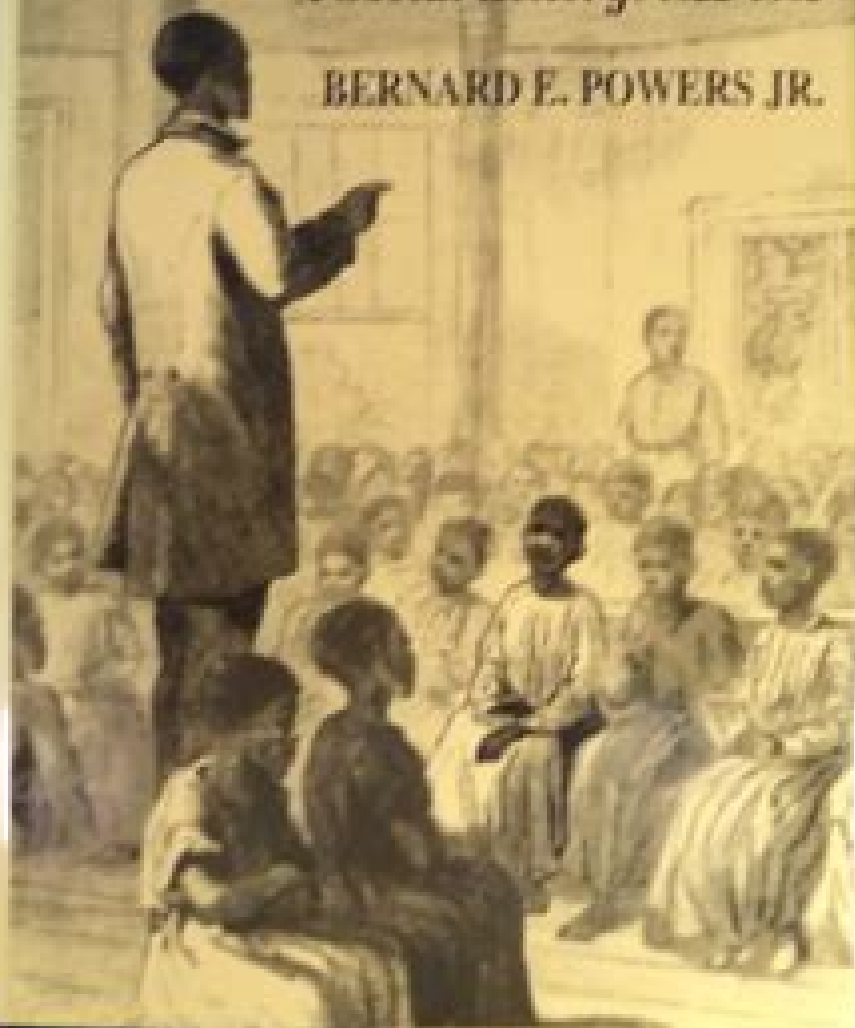

Jenkins attempts to understand how the freedmen saw themselves in the new order and to shed light on their hopes and aspirations He emphasizes not the defeat of these aspirations but rather the victories the freedmen won against white resistance **Entangled by White Supremacy** Janet G. Despite its significance in world and American history the World War I era is seldom identified as a turning point in southern history as it failed to trigger substantial economic political or social change in the South Yet in 1917 black and white reformers in South Carolina saw their world on the brink of momentous change In a state politically controlled by a white minority the war era incited oppositional movements As South Carolina s economy benefited from the war white reformers sought to use their newfound prosperity to

better the state's education system and economy and to provide white citizens with a better standard of living Black reformers however channeled the feelings of hope instilled by a war that would make the world safe for democracy into efforts that challenged the structures of the status quo In *Entangled by White Supremacy* Reform in World War I era South Carolina historian Janet G Hudson examines the complex racial and social dynamics at play during this pivotal period of U S history With critical study of the early war mobilization efforts public policy debates and the state's political culture Hudson illustrates how the politics of white supremacy hindered the reform efforts of both white and black activists The World War I period was a complicated time in South Carolina an era of prosperity and hope as well as fear and anxiety As African Americans sought to change the social order white reformers confronted the realization that their newfound economic opportunities could also erode their control Hudson details how white supremacy formed an impenetrable barrier to progress in the region *Entangled by White Supremacy* explains why white southerners failed to construct a progressive society by revealing the incompatibility of white reformers twin goals of maintaining white supremacy and achieving progressive reform In addition Hudson offers insight into the social history of South Carolina and the development of the state's crucial role in the civil rights era to come

Littlefield, Joan Marie Johnson, 2012-06-01 Covering an era from the early twentieth century to the present this volume features twenty seven South Carolina women of varied backgrounds whose stories reflect the ever widening array of activities and occupations in which women were engaged in a transformative era that included depression world wars and dramatic changes in the role of women Some striking revelations emerge from these biographical portraits in particular the breadth of interracial cooperation between women in the decades preceding the civil rights movement and ways that women carved out diverse career opportunities sometimes by breaking down formidable occupational barriers Some women in the volume proceeded cautiously working within the norms of their day to promote reform even as traditional ideas about race and gender held powerful sway Others spoke out more directly and forcefully and demanded change Most of the women featured in these essays were leaders within their respective communities and the state Many of them such as Wil Lou Gray Hilla Sheriff and Ruby Forsythe dedicated themselves to improving the quality of education and health care for South Carolinians Septima Clark Alice Spearman Wright Modjeska Simkins and many others sought to improve conditions and obtain social justice for African Americans Others including Victoria Eslinger and Tootsie Holland were devoted to the cause of women's rights Louise Smith Mary Elizabeth Massey and Mary Blackwell Butler entered traditionally male dominated fields while Polly Woodham and Mary Jane Manigault created their own small businesses A few including Mary Gordon Ellis Dolly Hamby and Harriet Keyserling exercised political influence Familiar figures like Jean Toal current chief justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court are included but readers also learn about lesser known women such as Julia and Alice Delk sisters employed in the Charleston Naval Yard during World War II

Thompson, 2015-04-15 An examination of the role and struggles of dockworkers enslaved and free in Charleston between the American Revolution and the Civil War Working on the Dock of the Bay explores the history of waterfront labor and laborers black and white enslaved and free native and immigrant in Charleston South Carolina between the American Revolution and Civil War Michael D Thompson explains how a predominantly enslaved workforce laid the groundwork for the creation of a robust and effectual association of dockworkers most of whom were black shortly after emancipation In revealing these wharf laborers experiences Thompson s book contextualizes the struggles of contemporary southern working people Like their postbellum and present day counterparts stevedores and draymen laboring on the wharves and levees of antebellum cities whether in Charleston or New Orleans New York or Boston or elsewhere in the Atlantic World were indispensable to the flow of commodities into and out of these ports Despite their large numbers and the key role that waterfront workers played in these cities premechanized labor intensive commercial economies too little is known about who these laborers were and the work they performed Though scholars have explored the history of dockworkers in ports throughout the world they have given little attention to waterfront laborers and dock work in the pre Civil War American South or in any slave society Aiming to remedy that deficiency Thompson examines the complicated dynamics of race class and labor relations through the street level experiences and perspectives of workingmen and sometimes workingwomen Using this workers eye view of crucial events and developments Working on the Dock of the Bay relocates waterfront workers and their activities from the margins of the past to the center of a new narrative reframing their role from observers to critical actors in nineteenth century American history Organized topically this study is rooted in primary source evidence including census tax court and death records city directories and ordinances state statutes wills account books newspapers diaries letters and medical journals

**How to Become an American** Daniel Wolff, 2022-12-13 An odyssey from pre Civil War Charleston to post World War II Minneapolis through Jewish immigrants eyes The histories of US immigrants do not always begin and end in Ellis Island and northeastern cities Many arrived earlier and some migrated south and west fanning out into their vast new country They sought a renewed life fresh prospects and a safe harbor despite a nation that was not always welcoming and not always tolerant How to Become an American begins with an abandoned diary and from there author Daniel Wolff examines the sweeping history of immigration into the United States through the experiences of one unnamed seemingly

unremarkable Jewish family and in the process makes their lives remarkable It is a deeply human odyssey that journeys from pre Civil War Charleston South Carolina to post World War II Minneapolis Minnesota In some ways the family s journey parallels that of the nation as it struggled to define itself through the Industrial Age A persistent strain of loneliness permeates this story and Wolff holds up this theme for contemplation In a country that prides itself on being a nation of immigrants where all men are created equal why do we end up feeling alone in the land we love     *The Accident of Color* Daniel Brook,2019-06-18 A technicolor history of the first civil rights movement and its collapse into black and white Brutal slavery existed all over the New World but only America followed emancipation with a twisted system of segregation The Accident of Color asks why Searching for answers Daniel Brook journeys to the places that resisted Jim Crow the longest In the cosmopolitan port cities of New Orleans and Charleston integrated streetcars plied avenues patrolled by integrated police forces for decades after the Civil War This progress was ushered in during Reconstruction when long free openly biracial communities joined in coalition with the formerly enslaved and allies at the fringes of whiteness Tragically their victories including integrated schools and their alliance itself were violently uprooted by segregation along a stark new black white color line By revisiting a turning point in the construction of America s uniquely restrictive racial system The Accident of Color brings to life a moment from our past that illuminates the origins of the racial lies we live by     The Mississippi Quarterly ,1996

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
