- Cortical Spreading Depression:
- FHM1 mutant presynaptic voltage gated Ca channels open to small membrane depolarizations
- Neuronal excitability is increased with more influx of Ca, release of glutamate and K
- FHM2: extracellular K builds up because mutant Na/K ATPase cannot bind K and exchange for Na results in increase glutamate
- ATP required to maintain neuronal membrane potential and used up to quickly

Mikati, Federico Vigevano, 2013-04-23 Alternating hemiplegia of childhood AHC is a very rare disease characterized by recurrent attacks of loss of muscular tone resulting in hypomobility of one side of the body The etiology of the disease due to ATP1A3 gene mutations in the majority of patients Few familial cases have been described AHC has an onset in the first few months of life Hemiplegic episodes are often accompanied by other paroxysmal manifestations such as lateral eyes and head deviation toward the hemiplegic side and a very peculiar monocular nystagmus As the attack progresses hemiplegia can shift to the other side of the body Sometimes the attack can provoke bilateral paralysis and these patients may have severe clinical impairment with difficulty in swallowing and breathing Hemiplegic attacks may be triggered by different stimuli like bath in warm water motor activity or emotion The frequency of attacks is high usually several in a month or in a week The duration is variable from a few minutes to several hours or even days Sleep can stop the attack Movement disorders such as dystonia and abnormal movements are frequent Cognitive delay of variable degree is a common feature Epilepsy has been reported in 50% of the cases but seizure onset is usually during the third or fourth year of life Many drugs have been used in AHC with very few results Flunarizine has the most supportive anecdotal evidence regarding efficacy Epilepsy and Movement Disorders Renzo Guerrini, 2002 The boundaries between epilepsy and movement disorders are difficult to define some syndromes or diseases may combine the two and many manifestations of one are similar to the other For the first time a distinguished international team of specialists comprehensively examines the clinical neurophysiological genetic pharmacological and molecular factors which underlie the relationships and differences between the two disorders They examine the methods for investigating motor cortex excitability and the electrophysiological and chemical characteristics of epilepsies which resemble movement disorders They present a scheme for neurophysiological classification of myoclonic epilepsies and myoclonus and give a detailed analysis of the disorders which cause diagnostic problems in children and adults There is also an innovative up to date review of the genetic syndromes which associate epilepsy and paroxysmal dyskinesias and a review of the drugs used to treat or which may precipitate epilepsy and movement disorders This is essential reading for clinicians and neuroscientists Non-epileptic Childhood Paroxysmal Disorders Francis J.
