

Drug Addiction and Treatment Careers Among Clients in the Drug Abuse Treatment Outcome Study (DATOS)

Considerable heterogeneity in patterns of addiction and treatment career histories was observed among the 10,010 clients participating in the Drug Abuse Treatment Outcome Study (DATOS). For half of the clients, DATOS was their first treatment episode; for the other half, their mean number of prior treatment episodes was 3.5. Type of treatment and cumulative length of treatment exposure reflected the interaction of clients' drug use patterns and the historical availability of different treatment approaches. Regression analyses showed that a higher level of prior treatment use was associated with more severe addiction career characteristics, injection drug use, and criminal activities. Effective and cost-effective approaches to treatment need to include more strategic interventions that consider clients' diverse treatment histories.

The past 20 years have witnessed a dramatic change in the characteristics of individuals entering drug treatment programs and in the patterns of their drug use. The Drug Abuse Treatment Outcome Study (DATOS), funded by the National Institute on Drug Abuse, provides

an opportunity to examine variations in drug use and treatment use over the "careers" of individuals entering drug abuse treatment in the 1990s (see Hubbard, Craddock, Flynn, Anderson, & Etheridge, 1997, and Flynn, Craddock, Hubbard, Anderson, & Etheridge, 1997, for a detailed exposition of DATOS). A career perspective assesses the dynamic patterns of drug abuse and its treatment over time (see Hser, Anglin, Grella, Longshore, & Prendergast, 1997, for a review of relevant literature). Previous research has established that initiation of drug use, drug use patterns, criminal activity, and treatment use vary by gender, ethnicity, age, and other factors (Anglin, Hser, & Booth, 1987; Anglin, Hser, & McGlothlin, 1987; Hser, Anglin, & Booth, 1987; Hser, Anglin, & McGlothlin, 1987; Maddux & Desmond, 1981; Narco, Balter, & Kinlock, 1994; Simpson, Joe, & Lehman, 1986; Stephens, 1991). Moreover, a treatment career approach can identify the factors associated with the continuation or cessation of drug use (Hser, Yamaguchi, Chen, & Anglin, 1995), with long-term morbidity and mortality (Hser, Anglin, & Powers, 1993; Hser, McCarthy, & Anglin, 1994), and with patterns of criminal behavior, employment, and family status over time (Anglin & Hser, 1991; Anglin, Speckart, Booth, & Ryan, 1989; McGlothlin & Anglin, 1981; McGlothlin, Anglin, & Wilson, 1977).

Drug and Alcohol Treatment Services Among Privately Insured Individuals in Managed Behavioral Health Care Bradley D. Blowing Smoke Michael J. Reznicek, 2012-02-16 Alcohol opiates cocaine and marijuana among other drugs have been used and abused for millennia Prior to the disease model approach to drug addiction which posits that addiction is a psychological and biological problem and that sufferers are victims societies had a workable solution let people consume what they want and let informal cultural controls reinforce responsible behavior Legal sanctions were reserved for any use that affected the safety of others Blowing Smoke proposes an approach to the war on drugs that returns us to the pre disease model era Dr Reznicek asserts that addiction is not a medical problem to be treated in rehab or by prohibiting substance use Rather he debunks the disease model arguing that it has exacerbated the problem by telling drug abusers that they are not responsible for their behavior that they are sick that they are not to blame He skillfully argues

for a new approach to drug use and abuse that requires a shift in the way we fight the war on drugs Dr Reznicek provides a new framework for understanding drug abuse the habit model Habits are practiced as long as they provide comfort and are abandoned when they cause pain The habit model is more consistent with current neuroscientific knowledge and it accounts for the widely observed phenomenon that most substance abusers don't change until they hit bottom the point where the consequences of drug use finally outweigh its benefits Using the habit model Dr Reznicek suggests the solution to the drug problem is to turn back the clock and to take lessons from societies that use social controls and consequences to deal with addiction and drug abuse He recommends the legalization of drugs for adults the implementation of social practices to dissuade abusers and the end to the use of rehab as a way of handling addiction Blowing Smoke shows how such an iconoclastic approach can work for us today
