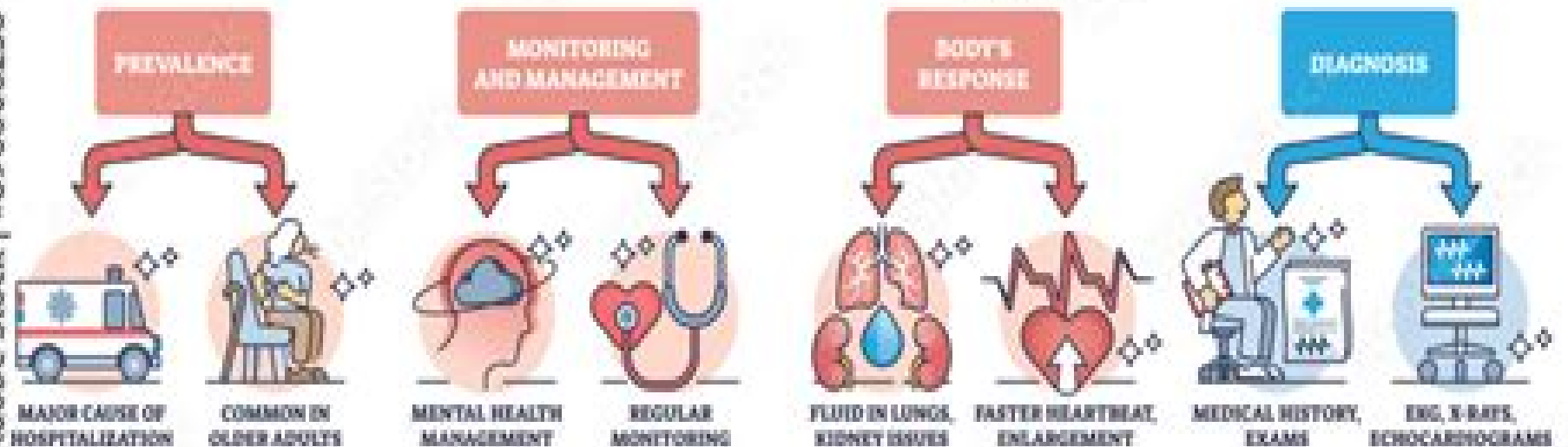
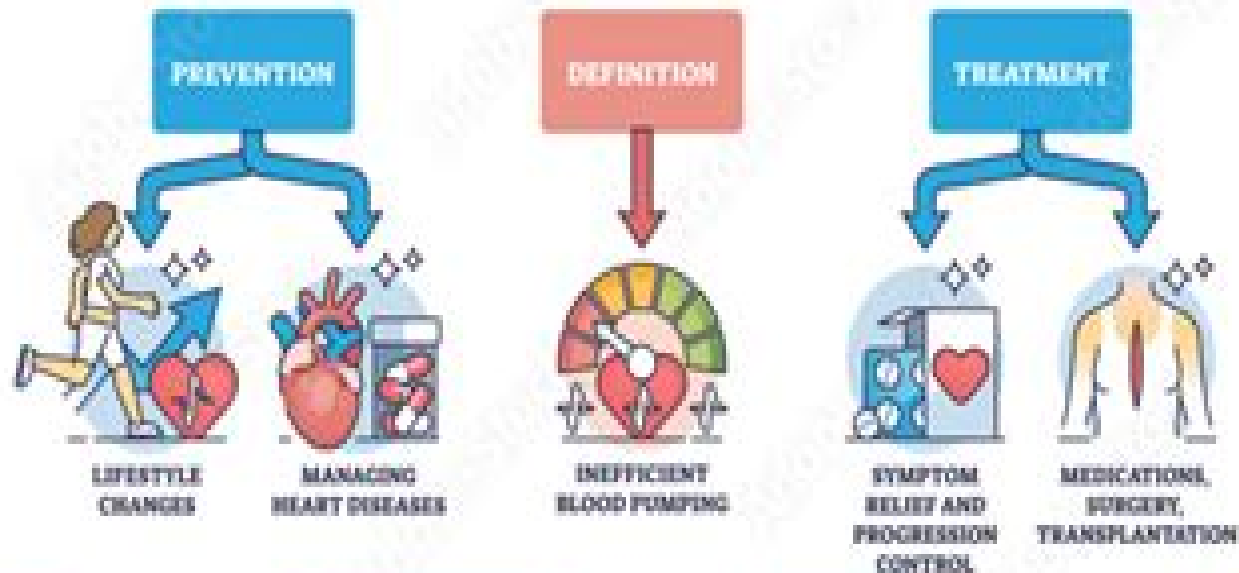

currently it may be difficult to believe early doubts were expressed as to whether interventions in risk factors for either coronary disease or stroke would actually lead to a reduction in the incidence of these disorders. However, large clinical trials in hypertension, carotid disease, atrial fibrillation, and antithrombotic and antiplatelet therapies have effectively demonstrated the efficacy of these targeted interventions in reducing stroke incidence. More recently, after earlier uncertainty regarding the role of elevated lipids as a risk factor for stroke, clinical trials of the statins have also demonstrated a significant reduction in the incidence of ischemic stroke. However, as emphasized in *Handbook of Stroke Prevention in Clinical Practice*, despite these gains and the initial decline in stroke incidence that did occur in the 1960s and 1970s, the incidence of stroke disappointingly has failed to show a further significant decline since that time. Farooqui, 2010-09-02 Collectively neurodegenerative diseases are characterized by chronic and progressive loss of neurons in discrete areas of the brain producing debilitating symptoms such as dementia loss of memory loss of sensory or motor capability decreased overall quality of life eventually leading to premature death Two types of cell death are known to occur during neurodegeneration a apoptosis and b necrosis The necrosis is characterized by the passive cell swelling intense mitochondrial damage with rapid loss of ATP alterations in neural membrane permeability high calcium influx and disruption of ion homeostasis This type of cell death leads to membrane lysis and release of intracellular components that induce inflammatory reactions Necrotic cell death normally occurs at the core of injury site In contrast apoptosis is an active process in which caspases a group of endoproteases with specificity for aspartate residues in protein are stimulated Apoptotic cell death is accompanied by cell shrinkage dynamic membrane blebbing chromatin condensation DNA laddering loss of phospholipids asymmetry low ATP levels and mild calcium overload This type of cell death normally occurs in penumbral

region at the ischemic injury site and in different regions in various neurodegenerative diseases

approximately 70% of all cases globally Recent advancements in brain imaging techniques have significantly expanded the treatment window for reperfusion therapies in carefully selected patients resulting in improved functional outcomes in the short and long term Intravenous thrombolysis IVT has proven effective in reducing disability when administered for up to 9 hours in patients with detectable salvageable brain tissue on perfusion imaging Endovascular thrombectomy EVT has emerged as a beneficial intervention for a wide range of patients with large vessel occlusion even up to 24 hours after stroke onset provided appropriate patient selection based on imaging criteria Conversely recent trials have demonstrated the superior efficacy of intensive pharmacological approaches such as dual antiplatelet therapy DAPT in preventing ischemic stroke recurrence particularly in high risk patients Despite significant advancements several controversies persist in the field of ischemic stroke management These controversies encompass various topics including determining the optimal secondary prevention strategy for patients with patent foramen ovale or strategies for ischemic stroke prevention in patients with atrial fibrillation following intracerebral hemorrhage Furthermore ongoing debates exist regarding the actual effectiveness of EVT in patients with large ischemic core distal vessel occlusion mild stroke syndromes or high baseline disability Additionally the comparative utility of IVT versus dual antiplatelet therapy for minor ischemic strokes remains a contentious issue Moreover discussions revolve around identifying the optimal delivery paradigm for EVT such as the choice between the drip and ship approach versus the mothership model
