Kamphaus, 2009-12-12 Psychologists offer an increasing variety of services to the public Among these services psychological assessment of personality and behavior continues to be a central activity One main reason is that other mental health professionals often do not possess a high level of competence in this area And when dealing with children and adolescents psychological assessment seems to take on an even greater role Therefore it follows that comprehensive graduate level instruction in assessment should be a high priority for educators of psychologists who will work with these youth This textbook is organized into three sections
