Blacks & Whites in São Paulo, Brazil, 1888-1988 George Reid Andrews, 1991 For much of the twentieth century Brazil enjoyed an international reputation as a racial democracy but that image has been largely undermined in recent decades by research suggesting the existence of widespread racial inequality George Reid Andrews provides the first thoroughly documented history of Brazilian racial inequality from the abolition of slavery in 1888 up to the late 1980s showing how economic social and political changes in Brazil during the last one hundred years have shaped race relations No laws of segregation or apartheid exist in Brazil but by looking carefully at government policies data on employment mainstream and Afro Brazilian newspapers and a variety of other sources Andrews traces pervasive discrimination against Afro Brazilians
