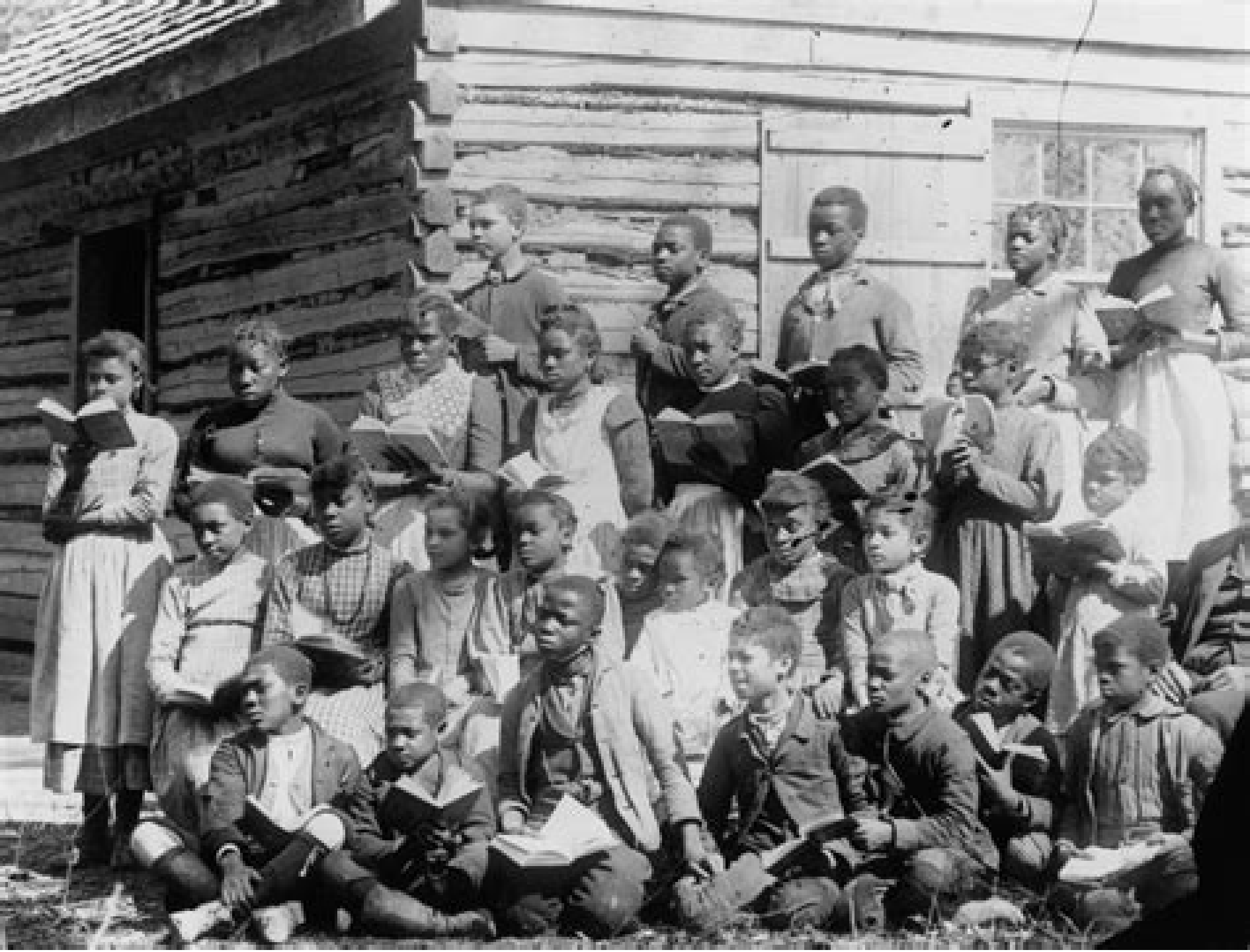

Anderson, 2010-01-27 James Anderson critically reinterprets the history of southern black education from Reconstruction to the Great Depression By placing black schooling within a political cultural and economic context he offers fresh insights into black commitment to education the peculiar significance of Tuskegee Institute and the conflicting goals of various philanthropic groups among other matters Initially ex slaves attempted to create an educational system that would support and extend their emancipation but their children were pushed into a system of industrial education that presupposed black political and economic subordination This conception of education and social order supported by northern industrial

philanthropists some black educators and most southern school officials conflicted with the aspirations of ex slaves and their descendants resulting at the turn of the century in a bitter national debate over the purposes of black education Because blacks lacked economic and political power white elites were able to control the structure and content of black elementary secondary normal and college education during the first third of the twentieth century Nonetheless blacks persisted in their struggle to develop an educational system in accordance with their own needs and desires

American Higher Education Transformed, 1940-2005 Wilson Smith, Thomas Bender, 2008-04-11 This long awaited sequel to Richard Hofstadter and Wilson Smith's classic anthology *American Higher Education A Documentary History* presents one hundred and seventy two key edited documents that record the transformation of higher education over the past sixty years The volume includes such seminal documents as Vannevar Bush's 1945 report to President Franklin D Roosevelt *Science the Endless Frontier* the U S Supreme Court decisions in *Brown v Board of Education* and *Sweezy v New Hampshire* and Adrienne Rich's challenging essay *Taking Women Students Seriously* The wide variety of readings underscores responses of higher education to a memorable often tumultuous half century Colleges and universities faced a transformation of their educational goals institutional structures and curricula and admission policies the ethnic and economic composition of student bodies an expanding social and gender membership in the professoriate their growing allegiance to and dependence on federal and foundation financial aids and even the definitions and defenses of academic freedom Wilson Smith and Thomas Bender have assembled an essential reference for policymakers administrators and all those interested in the history and sociology of higher education

Anderson, Haroon Khareem, 2009-01-16 Before the founding of the United States enslaved Africans advocated literacy as a method of emancipation During the Reconstruction period after the Civil War blacks were at the forefront of the debates on the establishment of public schools in the South In fact a wealth of ideas about the role of education in American freedom and progress emerged from African American civic political and religious communities and was informed by the complexity of the Black experience in America *Education as Freedom African American Educational Thought and Activism* is a groundbreaking edited text that documents and reexamines African American empirical methodological and theoretical contributions to

knowledge making teaching and learning and American education from the nineteenth through the twenty first century the most dynamic period of African American educational thought and activism African American thought and activism regarding education burgeoned from traditional academic disciplines such as philosophy and art mathematics and the natural sciences and history and psychology from the Black church as well as from grassroot political social cultural and educational activism with the desire to assess the stake of African Americans in modernity *Race, Class, and Education* Kenneth J. England, 1989 While most school systems have undergone some formal desegregation to eliminate inequities in access to education inequities and discrimination nonetheless remain In this study covering 170 major school districts during the years between 1968 and 1984 the authors discuss the remaining obstacles to equal opportunity in education Clustering of students into separate classes or groups of classes based on perceived learning potential is one form of discrimination that remains disciplinary policy resulting in suspension or expulsion is the other Based on their findings Meier Stewart and England argue that the single most important factor in improving the access of black students to equal educational opportunities is having black teachers in the classroom a goal attainable through use of the political system In a very concise book Meier Stewart and England build a damning case against standard education policies as contributors to the resegregation of our schools In the process they give us an excellent example of what good policy analysis is by carefully blending empirical documentation with evaluation and prescription Mary Kweit Public Administration Review *Handbook of Cultural Politics and Education*, 2010-01-01 In academia the effects of the cultural turn have been felt deeply In everyday life tenets from cultural politics have influenced how people behave or regard their options for action such as the reconfiguration of social movements protests and praxis in general Many authors writing in this field are known for their scholarship and social activism both of which are arguably guided by principles of cultural politics about the nature of representation and the deployment of power in political discourses The Handbook of Cultural Politics and Education is less an attempt to standardize contemporary educational scholarship and more a collection that engages the problems and promises of recent themes in social and cultural thought which require our attention and demand a response In other words it opens doors to questions rather than convenient answers to difficult educational dilemmas The Handbook is part of the appraisal of an opening created by interdisciplinary writings on such themes as representation civil society cultural struggle subjectivity and media within the context of education Indeed cultural politics troubles traditional frameworks in search of critical explanations concerning education s place within society The contributions in the collection support this endeavor

Teaching Equality Adam Fairclough, 2001-01-01 In *Teaching Equality* Adam Fairclough provides an overview of the enormous contributions made by African American teachers to the black freedom movement in the United States Beginning with the close of the Civil War when the efforts of the slave regime to prevent black literacy meant that blacks associated education with liberation Fairclough explores the development of educational ideals in the black community up through the years of the civil rights movement He traces black educators' connection to the white community and examines the difficult compromises they had to make in order to secure schools and funding Teachers did not he argues sell out the black community but instead instilled hope and commitment to equality in the minds of their pupils Defining the term teacher broadly to include any person who taught students whether in a backwoods cabin or the brick halls of a university Fairclough illustrates the multifaceted responsibilities of individuals who were community leaders and frontline activists as well as conveyors of knowledge He reveals the complicated lives of these educators who in the face of a prejudice based social order and a history of oppression sustained and inspired the minds and hearts of generations of black Americans
