Those photos and films are rare because people don t want to know the truth about the government s past TV newspapers and other MSM will not show a historic photo or video of the early American straight arm salute nor mention its history and impact worldwide American youth groups Scouting adopted Bellamy's American Nazi salute with Bellamy's
