The present study outlines the fields of indigenous writing in Australia and New Zealand in the crucial period between the mid 1980s and the early 1990s particularly eventful years in which postcolonial theory attempted to centre the margins and indigenous writers were keen to escape the particular centering offered in search of other positions more in tune with their creative sensibilities Indigenous writing relinquished its narrative preference for social realism in favour of traversing old territory in new spiritual ways roots converted into routes Standard postcolonial readings of indigenous texts often overwrite the difference they seek to locate because critical orthodoxy predetermines what difference can be Critical evaluations still tend to eclipse the ontological grounds of Aboriginal and M ori traditions and specific ways of moving through and behaving in cultural landscapes and social contexts
