Negotiating the Landscape explores the question of how medieval religious identities were shaped and modified by interaction with the natural environment Focusing on the Benedictine monastic community of Stavelot Malmedy in the Ardennes Ellen F. Arnold draws upon a rich archive of charters property and tax records correspondence miracle collections
