Sarno, 2005 Action action yet more action No action film worthy of genre would be caught dead without its fair share of red hot lead and no holds barred fistcuffs high octane pursuits and gravity defying gymnastics Then again nonstop action soon wears thin absent a rooting interest in Last Man Standing First Woman to Cross Finish Line Rooting interest inheres not in overt action no matter how artfully choreographed or breathtakingly executed Rather rooting interest comes from empathy for the protagonist and more precisely from the dramatic action embodied by the protagonist s struggle to accomplish a worthy goal opposed by a formidable foe Action is a double edged blade overt action being a necessary but insufficient condition to sustain viewer interest which soars and ebbs to extent that dramatic action intersects with injects meaningfulness into gunplay and fistfest acrobatics and pyrotechnics Lights Camera Action spotlights the essential elements of action comedy action romance and action adventure It underscores the crucial distinction between overt and dramatic action which a screenwriter must weave together in order for an action script to hum and shimmer pulsate and zing **The Thriller** Gregory G.
