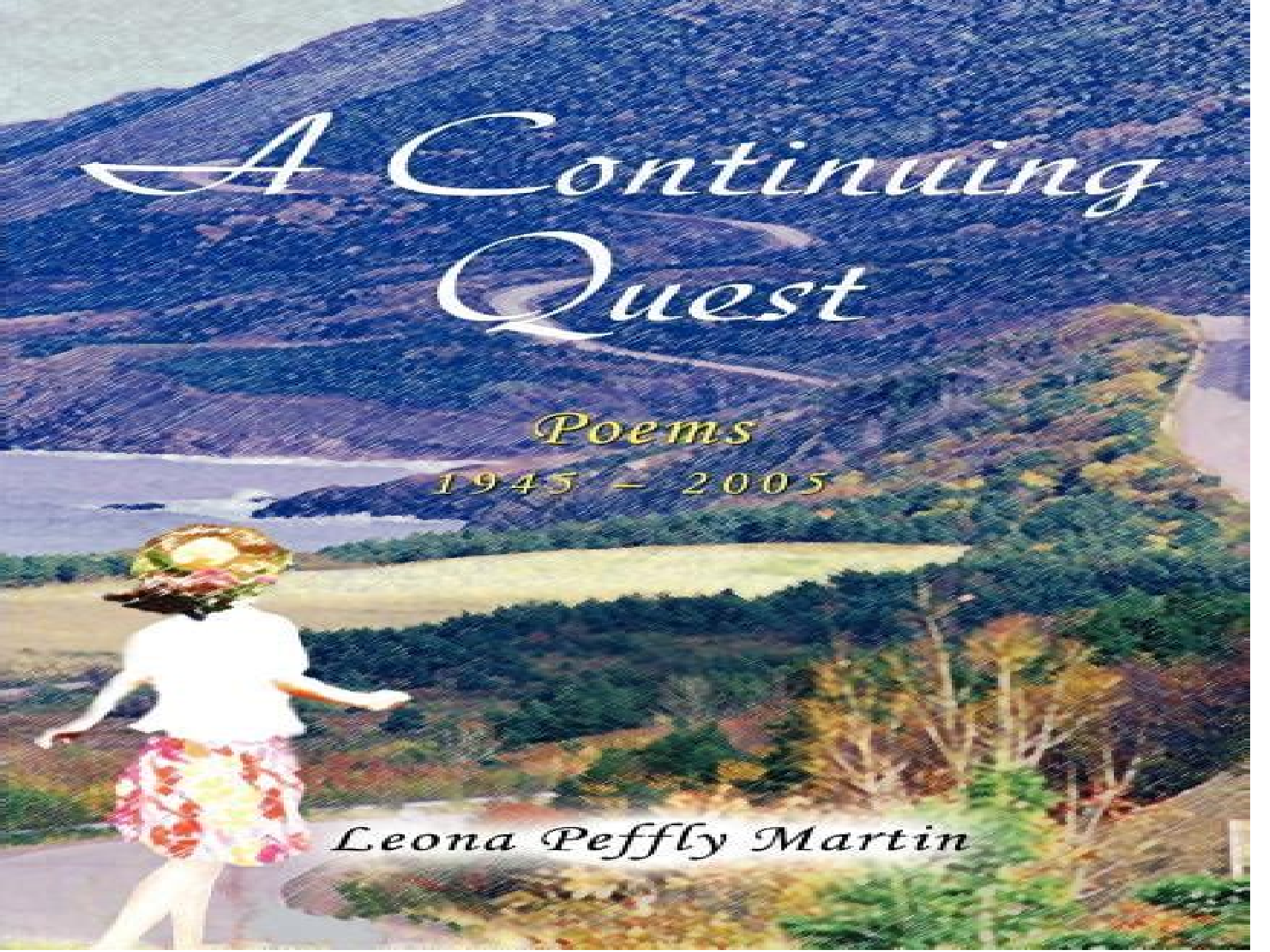

Continuing Quest A Poems:

The Poetry of James Wright Andrew Elkins, 1991 In *The Poetry of James Wright* the author traces Wright's formal evolution and concentrates on his consistent themes: the artist's role in society, the artist's search for poetic and personal identities, the power of poetry as fortification against the onslaughts of time, and the definition of a good and humane action. Charting the poet's evolution from his first book *The Green Wall* to the last collections *This Journey*, Elkins discusses one major book in each chapter, explicating the more important poems in detail and explaining how each volume is part of a progression from youthful imitator to mature innovator. Wright's individual struggle taking place as it did in the last half of the 20th century in America dramatizes the central problems of the creative individual in a late industrial society who is trying to turn a life into art. Wright worked in the great tradition of the adamant individualists in our literary heritage and like all of his formidable ancestors he refused to trust the socialized self he found attached to his soul; he refused to be diminished or circumscribed by any society's definition of himself. The effect of reading and studying his complete work is the recognition that Wright is a major 20th century American poet whose apparent simplicity and occasional sentimentality can obscure the complexity and maturity of his courageous confrontation with the problems of living and writhing in contemporary America.

New Explorations in Indian English Poetry Kanwar Dinesh Singh, 2004 *Quotation and Modern American Poetry* Elizabeth Gregory, 1996-07 In this volume Elizabeth Gregory addresses a number of key issues surrounding the formation of the American poetic canon. Taking as her primary examples T. S. Eliot's *Waste Land*, William Carlos Williams' *Paterson*, and selected poems by Marianne Moore, she examines the ways in which modern American writers struggled with questions of literary authority and cultural identity in relation to pre-existing European models. Gregory focuses on these issues through analysis of the use of quotation in modern and postmodern literature, a practice that was strikingly divergent from the accepted use of literary allusion. Her introduction traces a history of quotation as it has been practiced in literature from classical to modern times. She then focuses on the texts of Eliot, Williams, and Moore, three central figures of American modernism whose work the author believes represents a spectrum of responses to the established European model of poetical discourse. Gregory's selection of Moore also allows her to deal with feminist concerns as they emerge in the more general modernist dialogue: How was a female writer to make use of a literary canon that traditionally excluded female participation? The implications of Gregory's argument will surely be of especial interest to feminist scholars of American poetry. Lois Parkinson Zamora, University of Houston. *INDIAN POETRY IN ENGLISH : CRITICAL ESSAYS* ZINIA MITRA, 2016-07-01 Indian poets who wrote in English, a small middle class minority, were divided from the regional language poets by more than language for long. The English poets had a selected readership; they were known unto themselves in academic circles if they were widely published but were looked down upon with a kind of derision by regional writers. However, the scenario has changed now. From English being spurned as a colonizer's tongue that was nobody's language, it

Rethinking the North American Long Poem Ridvan Askin, Julius Greve, 2024-12-15 For centuries critics poets poet scholars and philosophers have either openly proclaimed or tacitly assumed the long poem as the highest expression of literary ambition and excellence *Rethinking the North American Long Poem* focuses on the North American variant of this notorious form notorious because of its often forbidding and difficult character particularly with respect to the dialectics of content and form aesthetics and politics matter and genre In nine essays and a contextual introduction the editors and contributors scrutinize seminal long poems by North American writers including Walt Whitman's *Song of Myself* Ezra Pound's *The Cantos* Muriel Rukeyser's *The Book of the Dead* and Charles Olson's *The Maximus Poems* They also explore recent efforts that have

Beginning in the thirteenth century, works of verse narrative from the early Middle Ages were recast in prose as if prose had become the literary norm. Instead of dying out, however, verse took on new vitality. Edwin Morgan was born in 1920 in Glasgow and studied at Glasgow University where he later taught literature He is much admired for his experimental writings his social poems as well as for the diversity of his output The present book comprises a chapter on Morgan's early vision poems which have received scant critical attention hitherto two on his hodoiporika *The Cape of Good Hope* and *The New Divan* a chapter on his deployment of the grotesque mode centred chiefly on the *Instamatic Poems* and *The Whittrick* another on his adaptations of the elegy in which Edgecombe propose a new genre called the thanasimon and finally an examination of his various monologic poems read in terms of his avowed enterprise of voicing the universe The study is topped by a prologue that sets out the consistency of Morgan's vision over time and tailed by an epilogue that connects his various critical pronouncements to his remarkably diverse output *Poetry and the Leningrad Religious-Philosophical Seminar 1974-1980*

Josephine von Zitzewitz,2016-05-12 The Religious Philosophical Seminar meeting in Leningrad between 1974-1980 was an underground study group where young intellectuals staged debates read poetry and circulated their own typewritten journal called 37 The group and its journal offered a platform to poets who subsequently entered the canon of Russian verse such as Viktor Krivulin 1944-2001 and Elena Shvarts 1948-2010 Josephine von Zitzewitz's new study focuses on the Seminar's identification of culture and spirituality which allowed Leningrad's unofficial culture to tap into the spirit of Russian modernism as can be seen in 37 This book is thus a study of a major current in twentieth century Russian poetry and an enquiry into the intersection between literary and spiritual concerns But it also presents case studies of five poets from a

special generation not only Krivulin and Shvarts but also Sergei Stratanovskii 1944 Oleg Okhapkin 1944 2008 and Aleksandr Mironov 1948 2010

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
