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A complete genetic classification of the world's languages arranged in terms of 17 independent phyla. Languages are given in capitalized lower-case letters, groups in all capitals. Languages and groups preceded by + are extinct. The number of languages in each group is shown as [*extant*+*extinct*] after the name of the group. The tree is condensed, with ungrouped siblings listed together as branch ".0". Thus the outline on the left stands for the outline on the right:

those belonging to the Na Dene and Eskimo Aleut families It examines the now widely held view that Haida the most distant language genetically is not to be included in Na Dene It confined itself to Sapir's data although the evidence could have been buttressed considerably by the use of more recent materials What survives is a body of evidence superior to that which could be adduced under similar restrictions for the affinity of Albanian Celtic and Armenian all three universally recognized as valid members of the Indo European family of languages A considerable number of historical hypotheses emerge from the present and the forthcoming volumes Of these the most fundamental bears on the question of the peopling of the Americas If the results presented in this volume and in the companion volume on Eurasiatic are valid the classification of the world's languages based on genetic criteria undergoes considerable simplification Languages of the World Martin D.
