Annotate your compositions to show size you are planning. If you plan to work large make sure you try a small section on a large scale first. If you work slowly, working small may be best and equally successful. What scale does the artist(s) you have looked at use?

A Series?



A series can be really striking. Make sure you have enough time to finish what you have planned. If you choose to create a series make sure each section works on its own and with the other sections.

Annotation of Compositions

Annotation should add something extra to what a viewer can see, for example the size. It should not state what you can see e.g. This is a picture of an apple. Your annotation should explain the following:

- what media you are using,
- what is going to happen in the background,
- which compositions you like and why,
- which compositions you feel are less successful and why,
- The size you are going to produce the work.
