It continues with sections on finding and watching raptors raptor identification hunting styles food breeding and behaviour and conservation. Appendices provide species accounts for diurnal breeding species in the high country with basic information about their ecology distribution and conservation as well as detailed instructions about handling an injured or orphaned raptor.
