explores the hero's account of his wanderings to the Phaeacians in Books 9-12 by exploring the poem's explanation of the hero's nostos return in the proem the spatial and temporal aspects of the wanderings the Phaeacian context of the Odysseus stories the implications of the ancient term *apologos* for Odysseus wanderings the patterns causality and plot of the *Apologos* and the socio-economic aspects of the wanderings Chapter 3 explores the actions of Odysseus upon his return to Ithaca Topics include the Homeric and non-Homeric aspects of Ithaca the motif of lying travelers at Ithaca the themes of the false travel tales that Odysseus tells while in disguise the function of these lying tales to test suitors slaves and family and an extensive comparison of the lying tales to the wanderings Chapter 4 first discusses issues arising at the end of the *Odyssey* which are described as indicative of existing or potential further adventures of Odysseus These post-nostos travels include Teiresias' prediction of the need to take an inland journey Odysseus' travel to Thesprotia in the *Telegony* and other lost tales about Odysseus traveling to northwest Greece or the Italian world Many tales involve locations linking themselves to the hero through genealogy or burial place

Child Autonomy and Child Governance in Children's Literature Christopher Kelen, Bjorn Sundmark, 2016-11-18 This book explores representations of child autonomy and self-governance in children's literature The idea of child rule and child realms is central to children's literature and childhood is frequently represented as a state of being with children seen as aliens in need of passports to Adultland and vice versa In a sense all children's literature depends on the idea that children are different separate and in command of their own imaginative spaces and places Although the idea of child rule is a persistent theme in discussions of children's literature or about children and childhood the metaphor itself has never been properly unpacked with critical reference to examples from those many texts that are contingent on the authority and/or power of children Child governance and autonomy can be seen as natural or perverse it can be displayed as a threat or as a promise Accordingly the child rule motif can be seen in Robinsonades and horror films in philosophical treatises and in series fiction The representations of self-ruling children are manifold and ambivalent and range from the idyllic to the nightmarish Contributors to this volume visit a range of texts in which children are in various ways empowered discussing whether childhood itself may be thought of as a nationality and what that may imply This collection shows how representations of child governance have been used for different ideological aesthetic and pedagogical reasons and will appeal to scholars of children's literature childhood studies and cultural studies

Children differ from adults in many ways The specialist in child or adolescent psychiatry knows not only that one must attend to special social and family issues for juveniles but that juveniles are more complex internally as well They attempt to survive in the world while rapidly growing and learning usually with physically and emotionally immature resources They have had few years in which to develop experience and do not have the psyche with which to integrate that experience in ways one would expect of a mature adult Sometimes this frightens the patient as in the case of a physically large teenager whose impulse control is impaired Sometimes it is frustrating as in the case of a healthy child unable to escape from a dysfunctional family It is always confusing and usually uncomfortable
