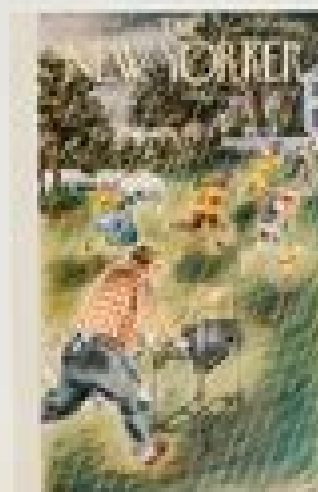
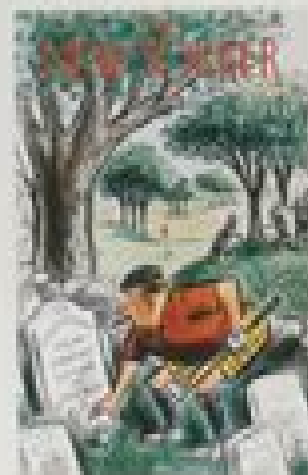
THE NEW YORKER



Everyone seems to have a notion of what makes a *New Yorker* cover, but it would be difficult to find a common stylistic denominator in the works of, say, Arthur Ghez, George Price, Ed Keras, Neal Benezberg, Gertrude Dow Simpson, Chuck Brown, Peter Arno, and Constantine Manolis. There is one thing, however, that these covers do share—each is clearly the work of a distinctive artistic personality. If the covers of the magazine vary one way or another, it is contained in this single fact: they announce *The New Yorker* as a weekly forum for a wide range of distinctive talents: poets, writers, journalists, and artists come together to discuss, in their various voices, the issues of the day or yesterday or, occasionally, tomorrow.


To select a particular questioner, James Garthoff once defined a *New Yorker* cover as "Whatever I like." In fact, since *The New Yorker* did not at that time commission cover work, the covers could be more accurately described as representing what the artists liked. Until recently the covers of *The New Yorker* were related to the editorial content of the magazine and often, with the exception of the changing seasons and the required holi-

days, seemed to have little to do with the world outside the magazine. World War II, of course, was too large to be ignored, but in general the covers reflected the passing parade inconspicuously, if at all. The war seemed either large and impersonal—Arthur Ghez's caricatures, Charles Martin's scenes of Central Park—or small-scale and personal—the quiet hours of Mary Petty or the great scenes of John Ficker. Covers that were essentially colored cartoons, such as this example by Whitney Darrow, Jr., continued to appear but not as frequently as before the war.
