His conviction that art should be multifunctional is basic to the author's views on art in the city; he regards most American cities as dehumanizing wastelands of aesthetic squalor dominated by the demands of the automobile and leads him to a helpful discussion of its role in worship and the church. Developing an aesthetic that is basically grounded yet always sensitive to the human need for beauty, Wolterstorff makes a brilliant contribution to understanding how art can serve to broaden and enrich our lives.
