their findings in various articles and books opening new vistas for all interested in this growing field of study at least for those who read Chinese Fortunately Henning's work is in English This anthology is not an easy read for those unfamiliar with Chinese history the various dynasties the terminology and variety of martial systems However it will no doubt benefit the serious scholar of Chinese martial arts and hopefully others will likewise benefit by patiently reading each chapter to broaden their understanding of the rich martial culture of China
